SCHOFIELD**



A state funeral will commemorate the life and public service of former Saskatchewan Lieutenant Governor Honorary Colonel the Honourable Vaughn Solomon Schofield, S.O.M., C.D., S.V.M.

Solomon Schofield was Saskatchewan's 21st Lieutenant Governor, serving from 2012 through 2018. She died in Regina on April 8, 2026, after a short illness.

The public is invited to attend the funeral on Saturday, April 25, 2026. The service will be held at Living Hope Alliance Church at 3800 Green Falls Drive in Regina, beginning at 10 a.m. Those attending are asked to arrive early.

HALL OF VALOUR UNVEILED AT THE SASKATCHEWAN LEGISLATIVE BUILDING



Premier Scott Moe and Provincial Military Liaison Blaine McLeod joined members of the Canadian Armed Forces and Canadian veterans for the official naming of the Hall of Valour at the Saskatchewan Legislative Building.

"The brave men and women of our Canadian Armed Forces are deserving of our gratitude, whether they have served in times of conflict or peace," Premier Moe said. "The Hall of Valour stands as a lasting expression of our remembrance and appreciation for that service. It is an immense privilege to live in a Canada that is strong and free, and the seat of Saskatchewan's government will honour that privilege by recognizing all who serve."

The Victoria Cross is the highest honour for valour in the Commonwealth. Created in 1856 by Queen Victoria, it was established to recognize soldiers for exceptional bravery during the Crimean War. Until 1945, approximately one hundred Canadians were awarded the Victoria Cross. Since 2018, the Hall of Valour has featured portraits of 15 Saskatchewan recipients commemorating their service to Saskatchewan and to Canada.

The Canada Victoria Cross was established in 1993 as the highest honour in Canada's military honours system, recognizing members of the Canadian Armed Forces for extraordinary valour and devotion to duty in the presence of hostile forces. To date, it has not been awarded.

Provincial Military Liaison Blaine McLeod joined Canadian veterans and their families in Ottawa on April 15, 2026, to present a petition to the federal government calling for the creation of an [Independent Military Honours Review Board](#)



"Thousands of Canadians have served since World War II and hundreds have made the ultimate sacrifice for their country and the values that all Canadians share," McLeod said. "Now is the time to restore the honour of the Victoria Cross and recognize the bravery and valour in the presence of the enemy demonstrated by armed forces personnel as Canada continues to stand on the global stage, ready to defend our sovereignty as a nation."

Room 218 in the Legislative Building will have "Hall of Valour" in bronze at its entrance, with a plaque stating:

"The Hall of Valour is dedicated to the soldiers and veterans who have served our country with great courage and valour."

"The people of Saskatchewan and Canada are forever grateful for your service and sacrifice which has preserved our freedom."

"The Hall of Valour is a reminder to all who visit and to all who serve in Saskatchewan's Legislative Assembly that our democratic freedoms are preserved and protected by the brave men and women of Canada's Armed Forces."

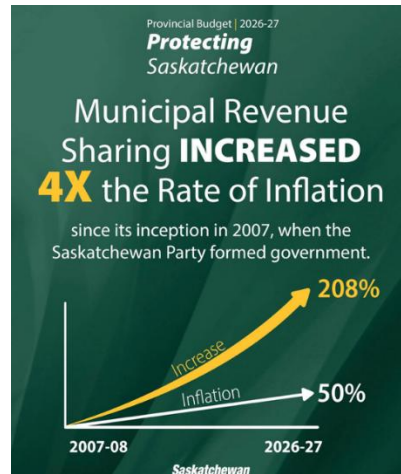

MINISTER RE-ESTABLISHES ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON LABOUR RELATIONS AND WORKPLACE SAFETY

SASKATCHEWAN'S LABOUR MARKET REMAINS STRONG WITH 15,000 FULL TIME JOBS CREATED IN MARCH

15,000 FULL-TIME JOBS ADDED

Saskatchewan's labour market remained strong in March with the lowest unemployment rate among the provinces.

The latest labour force numbers from Statistics Canada's show that the labour market in Saskatchewan remains strong with 15,000 full time jobs added year-over-year. Saskatchewan's unemployment rate of five per cent is the lowest amongst provinces and well below the national average of 6.7 per cent. Saskatchewan's seasonally adjusted employment growth rate was also second among provinces (0.9 per cent), increasing by 5,800 from the previous month.

"March was a strong month for Saskatchewan's labour market," Immigration and Career Training Minister Eric Schmalz said. "Our government is protecting Saskatchewan's workforce through partnerships with industry to ensure that Saskatchewan people are prepared to meet the demand created

by our strong and growing economy."

DID YOU KNOW?

Saskatchewan Tax Credits



Active Families Benefit – Refundable tax credit up to \$300 per child, or \$400 per child with a disability. Household income threshold of \$120,000.

Graduate Retention Program – Non-Refundable tax credit claimed over 10 years of up to \$24,000 in tuition rebate for completing a post-secondary program (i.e., undergraduate, diploma, or journey persons program) and choosing to stay and work in Saskatchewan.

Volunteer First Responders' Tax Credit – Non-refundable tax credit for volunteer firefighters, volunteer search and rescue personnel and volunteer emergency medical first responders who perform at least 200 hours of service to claim up to \$630.

First-Time Homebuyers' Tax Credit – Non-refundable tax credit allowing first time home buyers to claim the first \$15,000 of a home's purchase price for a maximum benefit of \$1,575.

Home Renovation Tax Credit – Non-refundable credit that allows homeowners to claim up to \$4,000 in home renovation expenses annually, for a maximum benefit of \$420.

Disability Tax Credits – Including the Disability Amount and Disability Supplement for Persons Under Age 18 – a non-refundable tax credit for individuals with severe and prolonged physical and mental disabilities or their family members, and an additional amount on top of the base disability amount to acknowledge that children with disabilities often require extra care.

Caregiver Tax Credit – Non-refundable tax credit for individuals providing in-home care for adult infirm dependent relatives, or parents or grandparents aged 65 or older.

Fertility Treatment Tax Credit – One-time refundable tax credit of 50 percent of the eligible costs for fertility treatment, for a maximum benefit of \$10,000.

Saskatchewan Low Income Tax Credit – Refundable tax credit that provides a quarterly non-taxable payment to low and moderate-income households regardless of whether the recipient pays income tax.

Refundable Tax Credit definition: A taxpayer can claim the full amount of a credit regardless of how much tax is owing in the taxation year, which could include a refund payment.

Non-refundable Tax Credit definition: A taxpayer can only claim the amount of the credit that reduces a taxpayer's tax payable to zero dollars.

Minister Jim Reiter, "Our government is committed to providing meaningful, long-term permanent tax relief while maintaining strong public services and a growing economy. Saskatchewan has a wide range of unique tax credits designed to make life more affordable and, as the April 30 tax deadline approaches, I wanted to take an opportunity to highlight important benefits you may be eligible to claim.

Saskatchewan is in the second year of our four-year commitment to lower

income taxes for everyone. This includes increases to the basic personal exemption tax credit amount; the spousal and equivalent-to-spouse tax credit amount, the senior supplement amount and the dependent child tax credit amount by \$500 each again this year. These amounts will increase by \$500 each again next year and again the year after. This is in addition to annual indexation increases that offset the impacts of inflation.

A Saskatchewan family of four now pays no provincial income tax on their first \$65,000 of income – the highest tax-free earning threshold in Canada. Further, for example, a family of four earning \$100,000 will pay nearly \$4,500 less in provincial income tax. And if that family claims any of the unique credits, they will save even more."

RECAP - YOUR LEGISLATIVE REPORT

We didn't have a newsletter last week, so here is a recap:



Across Saskatchewan, people want to see real progress in their everyday lives, whether that's finding a good job, accessing health care closer to home or seeing improvements in their communities. That momentum is showing up across the province in job growth, economic performance, health care access and community investments because protecting Saskatchewan means delivering results that matter.

Saskatchewan's economy remains strong with 15,000 full-time jobs created in March. Our province's unemployment rate of five per cent is the lowest among provinces and well below the national average of 6.7 per cent. This growth reflects the resilience of our workforce and the confidence employers have in our province. More people working full-time means more stability for families and more opportunity for our growing communities.

That momentum is also reflected in our trade sector. Saskatchewan ranked first in Canada for wholesale trade growth with a 15.3 per cent increase in February 2026 compared to February last year. This highlights the strength of our producers and exporters, and our ability to compete in national and global markets. These results show that our province continues to be a leader in economic performance, and our government will continue protecting our provincial economy.

Protecting a strong economy means continuing to invest in the infrastructure that supports it. Highways Minister Kim Gartner recently announced upcoming projects in Estevan, North Battleford, Prince Albert and Swift Current, supported by the provincial government's annual Urban Highway Connector Program. These projects will improve transportation links, benefiting local traffic and commuters, and keeping the provincial highway network better connected to move our export-based economy and support Saskatchewan's quality of life. In health care, our government continues to make progress on both access and services. We have reached a six-year agreement with Saskatchewan optometrists, helping to ensure residents can continue to receive quality eye care in our province. The agreement continues funding for annual eye exams for children under 18, patients with diabetes and those covered under Supplementary Health, Family Health Benefits and Seniors Income Plan Benefits. It also supports the Children's Vision Initiative, which helps raise awareness among parents and teachers about the importance of regular eye exams for children.

We are also pleased to share that we are expanding diagnostic services with a second mobile mammography unit now ready to serve communities across Saskatchewan. The second unit features a state-of-the-art digital mammography machine and new furnishings, following the recent launch of the first enhanced mobile mammography unit in January. With two operational units, screening capacity will grow and bring lifesaving breast health screening services closer to home for more women. Our

government thanks the Cancer Foundation of Saskatchewan and its generous donors for supporting efforts to improve access to breast cancer screening, helping detect issues earlier and improve patient outcomes.

To further strengthen care across Saskatchewan, the Rural and Remote Recruitment Incentive (RRRI) is being expanded to more communities, for a total of 82 now eligible. The program offers incentive packages of up to \$50,000 for a three-year return-in-service agreement for certain high-priority health occupations needed in these communities. The RRRI is supported by an investment of \$8.7 million in the 2026-27 budget to maintain and expand the program. Community safety remains a priority for our government, especially in our growing and vibrant communities. That's why we are investing in small town and rural police services to ensure officers have the tools and resources they need to keep residents safe. With the introduction of the Small Town and Rural Police Services Grant Program, we are investing \$190,000 to support small town and rural police services. The program provides \$10,000 for every sworn officer serving in these services this year. This is another step forward in protecting Saskatchewan and helping to keep our communities safer through strong policing supports.

Strong communities are built not only through safe streets, but also by supporting the organizations and people who have helped shape them. Another important part of that commitment is ensuring our veterans, and their organizations have the support they need to continue their important work. Applications are now open for the Saskatchewan Veterans Service Club Support Program, which provides grants of up to \$30,000 to local Legion branches and veterans' organizations. The application deadline is May 15, 2026.

Our commitment to strong communities extends beyond supporting veterans' organizations. It also includes recognizing and celebrating the diverse cultures, faiths and traditions that make up a strong Saskatchewan. Our government has passed The From Many Peoples, Strength Act. This new

framework will eliminate the need for representatives of cultural and faith groups to request formal proclamation of their heritage recognition day, week or month each year. Including all heritage recognitions under a single framework reflects the diversity that makes our province strong and reinforces our commitment to building an inclusive and respectful future for everyone.

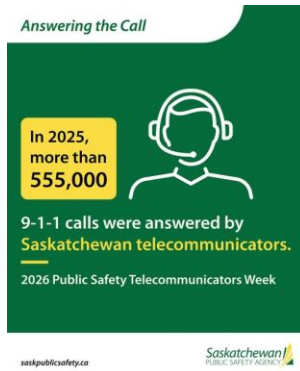
