

FISHING? BE SURE TO KNOW THE TYPES OF BAIT YOU CAN USE




When fishing in Saskatchewan be sure you know the types of bait you can use.

There are a few rules and regulations you should be aware of including:

- Live fish may not be used as bait.
- Only dead baitfish that's been commercially frozen or preserved may be used.
- Only leeches originating within Saskatchewan may be used as live bait.
- Frogs, salamanders and crayfish may not be used as bait.

CROP REPORT FOR THE PERIOD OF AUGUST 8 - AUGUST 14, 2023



Scattered showers across the province paused harvest for a short time, but producers welcomed the moisture. Saskatchewan crops are nine per cent harvested this week, ahead of the five-year average of eight per cent and the 10-year average of five per cent.

GET YOUR DUCKS IN A ROW BEFORE HUNTING SEASON BEGINS

Hunting Season is almost here!

For a comprehensive list of season dates, regulations, fees, licenses and other hunting information *visit saskatchewan.ca/hunting*.



Hunting season is approaching, and the Ministry of Environment is reminding hunters that now is the time to plan and prepare.

Saskatchewan Hunters and Trappers Guide

Season start dates vary depending on the wildlife management zone, hunting method and game species. The Saskatchewan Hunters and Trappers Guide includes a comprehensive list of season dates that all hunters should know.

The guide also includes important information on hunting and trapping regulations, licences and fees, and highlights of what is new for 2023 - including new wolf hunting opportunities.

Printed copies of the Saskatchewan Hunters and Trappers Guide are available at Ministry of Environment field offices with front counter service, licence issuers, conservation field offices and some provincial parks.

Hunting licences

Big Game Draw licences are available for purchase as of August 1. Regular licences are available beginning August 15.

Hunters have a few options to purchase a licence:

- Online through the Hunting, Angling and Trapping Licence (HAL) system, any time of the day.
- In person from any Saskatchewan hunting licence issuer.
- In person at a Ministry of Environment office with front counter service or at select provincial park offices.
- By phone at 1-855-848-4773 (you will require a credit card).

Hunters must provide their HAL identification number, or any other identification number previously added to their HAL account.

Permission to hunt on private lands

Approximately 85 per cent of the land in southern Saskatchewan is privately owned or controlled. Hunters are legally required to obtain consent from the landowner or occupant prior to hunting:

- Consent can be provided in writing, orally or through signage.
- Consent can be sought and provided by any method including in person, by telephone and through email.

On the website

The Government of Saskatchewan website has useful information that will inform every step of planning a hunting trip, including:

- The 2022 <u>Hunter Harvest Survey</u> results (as well as results from previous years).
- The 2022-23 <u>CWD Surveillance Program</u> results (summary and map), along with other information about CWD testing
- All the relevant guides and supplements posted in the Publications Centre.

Packaging your fish for transport



(1) Whole (Round)

- head and entrails intact
- can be easily counted and identified



(2) Headless Dressed

- head and entrails removed
- can be easily counted and identified



(3) Fillets

- at least 2.5 cm (1 in) patch of skin and scales intact on body (not belly)
- only two fillets per package
- can be easily counted and identified





You got so excited that you caught some fish that you forgot the rules for transporting them. We're here to help!

Leave a small (2.5 cm) patch of skin and scales so the species can be easily identified.

Here are some of the ways you can transport fish:

- · Whole: leave the head and tail intact;
- · Headless: remove the head and entrails; or
- Fillets: include at least 2.5 cm of skin and scale intact; limit of two fillets per package.

Packaging helps conservation officers ensure anglers stay within their limits.





Wholesale trade saw year-over-year growth, with a 70.5 per cent increase compared to June 2022 (seasonally adjusted). There was a total of \$7.2 billion in wholesale trade in June 2023.


SASKATCHEWAN HOUSING STARTS SOAR


