REMEMBERING LYLE STEWART



We are deeply saddened by the passing of our colleague, Lyle Stewart. His dedicated service to our province and his cherished friendship will be profoundly missed. Our heartfelt sympathy goes out to his family during this difficult time. Rest in Peace Lyle.

Lyle was first elected to the Assembly in 1999 and represented areas of Thunder Creek and Lumsden-More for 23 years. Prior to being known as the Minister of Agriculture from 2012-2018, Lyle served as the interim leader of the Saskatchewan Party.

Lyle Stewart leaves a legacy of honesty, integrity, and kindness. It was indeed a privilege to serve with him.

Tributes continue to pour in for Lyle. The flags at the Saskatchewan Legislature will be lowered to half-mast.

Premier Scott Moe, "Another difficult day as we have lost another friend and colleague. Lyle Stewart, long-time Saskatchewan Party MLA and former Agriculture Minister has passed away at the age of 73 following a lengthy battle with cancer. Lyle was the MLA for Thunder Creek and Lumsden-Morse and a key member of our team for nearly 24 years, from 1999 until his retirement from politics last year. Lyle was a man of few words, which is unusual for a politician, but you always knew

where he stood. His quiet strength and dedication to the people he served were an example to all of us who served with him.

Lyle was a good friend and I will miss him a lot.

On behalf of our government and the province, I want to express my deepest condolences to the family and many friends of Lyle Stewart. Flags at the Legislature will be lowered to half-mast in his honour."

He led crop insurance expansion, was a great provincial rep negotiating the suite of fed prov programs and was a tireless trade mission traveler to both steward and open new markets for our producers. He was generous including to hitch hikers ...but Clint Eastwood when they turned out to be would-be car jackers. He was a confidant who gave me valued, honest and wise counsel. He was my friend. I am going to miss him. Rest in peace my friend."

YOUR LEGISLATIVE REPORT



Saskatchewan's economy is stable and our province remains one of the most affordable places in the nation to invest, live, work and raise a family. Saskatchewan saw a 12.9 per cent increase in building construction investments from May 2023 to May 2024, seasonally-adjusted. The province also ranked first in the nation for growth in retail trade, increasing by 6.1 per cent from May 2023 to May 2024. The total value of retail trade sales in May 2024 was \$2.2 billion.

Morningstar DBRS recently affirmed the province's AA (low) credit rating and stable outlook. Saskatchewan currently has the second-highest credit rating among the provinces when all three major rating agencies (Moody's, Morningstar DBRS, and S&P) are considered. In June 2024, S&P Global Ratings gave Saskatchewan the highest credit rating among Canadian provinces.

Statistics Canada's latest GDP numbers indicate that Saskatchewan's 2023 real GDP reached an all-time high of \$77.9 billion, increasing by \$1.2 billion, or 1.6 per cent. This places Saskatchewan second in the nation for real GDP growth, above the national average of 1.2 per cent.

A strong and growing economy allows us to invest in the programs and services that matter most to Saskatchewan people, such as healthcare. The province's Health Human Resources (HHR) Action Plan to recruit, train, incentivize and retain health care workers continues to show strong results across the province.

The first of 27 new permanent Nurse Practitioner positions available across rural, remote and regional areas was filled in Maple Creek. The application and hiring process for the remaining positions is ongoing, and qualified NPs are encouraged to apply.

More than 330 hard-to-recruit positions have been filled through the Rural and Remote Recruitment Incentive program. Another 237 Internationally-Educated Health Professionals from the Philippines are now working throughout the province. In addition, applications are still being accepted for the Final Clinical Placement

Bursaries. Ten new psychiatrists have accepted letters of offer and are moving through the onboarding process.

Our government, along with the Saskatchewan Health Authority (SHA) are pleased to announce the successful recruitment of pediatric gastroenterologist Dr. Rabin Persad, who will begin practicing in the province on October 1, 2024. Children with gastrointestinal issues and their families will soon have local access to care in the province, reducing wait times and travel.

Our government is committed to investing in Saskatchewan communities to ensure they remain the best place to live, work and raise a family. Under the Targeted Sector Support (TSS) initiative, \$620,000 was recently invested in 22 projects to strengthen municipal service delivery and enhance governance and administrative capacity. Since inception, over \$9 million has been allocated to the TSS Initiative.

Saskatchewan is grown through investment in projects that support the longevity and vibrancy of communities and improve the lives of residents. The specialized TSS funding provided in partnership with Saskatchewan's municipal associations supports municipalities to work together to better serve their citizens.

To further strengthen our province's communities, Lotteries and Gaming Saskatchewan provided \$1.16 million in charitable gaming grants in the first quarter of 2024-25, benefiting more than 750 groups and organizations across the province. The grants support hundreds of charitable and nonprofit groups throughout Saskatchewan, including those focused on amateur sport, culture, the arts, animal rescue, service clubs and much more.

Over the next two years, our government is providing \$2 million to Food Banks of Saskatchewan to help Saskatchewan families and food banks with high food costs. Food Banks of Saskatchewan will receive \$1 million in August and another \$1 million in 2025-26.

The Government of Saskatchewan and Saskatchewan Health Authority (SHA) are pleased to announce the successful recruitment of pediatric gastroenterologist Dr. Rabin Persad, who will begin practicing in Saskatchewan on October 1, 2024. The successful recruitment of a pediatric gastroenterologist will further facilitate the expansion of a comprehensive child and youth gastroenterology program with a provincial scope.

"The addition of Dr. Persad to Saskatchewan's health care team is significant for the future of pediatric gastroenterology in our province," Health Minister Everett Hindley said. "Children with gastrointestinal issues - and their families - will have local access to timely and effective care, reducing wait times and the need for lengthy travel."

"The SHA welcomes Dr. Persad to the team of health care professionals who support the children, youth and families impacted by pediatric digestive system and liver-related issues or pain," Provincial Head of Pediatrics for both the SHA and University of Saskatchewan's College of Medicine Dr. Terry Klassen said. "The addition of Dr.

Persad will support the ongoing development of a comprehensive children's gastroenterology program for Saskatchewan and improve much-needed access to physician care here in the province. We continue to actively recruit other pediatric gastroenterologist subspecialists."



PROVINCE PROVIDES \$2 MILLION TO FOOD BANKS OF SASKATCHEWAN

Investing \$2 Million in Food Banks

Food Banks of Saskatchewan will receive \$1 million this August and another \$1 million in 2025-26.



The Government of Saskatchewan is providing \$2 million over the next two years to Food Banks of Saskatchewan to help Saskatchewan families and food banks with high food costs.

"Saskatchewan continues to be one of the most affordable places in Canada to live, work and raise a family," Social Services Minister Gene Makowsky said. "Since the provincial budget was announced in March, the cost of food has continued to increase. This funding to Food Banks of Saskatchewan is an additional affordability measure from our government to help families and individuals manage rising daily living costs due to inflation."

Food Banks of Saskatchewan will receive a \$1 million grant in August, and another \$1 million grant in 2025-26. The Ministry of Social Services is partnering with Food Banks of Saskatchewan to distribute the funding to agencies based on the population and average food bank usage of the communities they serve.

"Saskatchewan Food Banks have had their busiest year yet, making it challenging to build up sufficient food reserves," Food Banks of Saskatchewan Executive Director Michael Kincade said. "Inflation continues to accelerate, seriously impacting hunger and food insecurity, not only with low-income households, but even those in higher income brackets. With demand increasing and donations decreasing, this help comes at a critical time to help us feed our friends, neighbours, and families."

DECIDING TO GO TO THE EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT



DECIDING TO COME TO THE EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT

Information for Parents

Does my child or youth need emergency care?

As a parent or guardian, you know your child best. The Emergency Department is always here for you. Here are some examples to help you decide if your child is in need of emergency care:

| EMERGENCY | NOT AN EMERGENCY |
|---|---|
| <p>Fever: less than 3 months old, immune system problems or complex chronic health problems; very sleepy or difficult to wake.</p> <p>Breathing Problems: respiratory distress (working hard to breathe, breathing faster than normal), pale skin, whitish or blue lips, asthma or wheezing not responding to usual puffers or chest pain.</p> <p>Vomiting or diarrhea: less than 3 months old, repeated vomiting and unable to keep liquids down (any age, if it lasts 8 hours or more), vomiting and diarrhea containing large amount of blood, dehydration with dry mouth or no urine more than 12 hours.</p> <p>Injuries: head injuries with loss of consciousness (passing out or confusion or repeated vomiting, cuts that may need stitches, burns that blister and are larger than a Loonie, injury to arm or leg causing large swelling or inability to use the limb, eye injuries or injury causing chest or stomach pain.</p> <p>Rashes: rash with fever that looks like tiny or expanding bruises, hives along with difficulty breathing or vomiting/diarrhea.</p> | <p>Fever: healthy and vaccinated babies and children who appear generally well and playful when the fever is down with ibuprofen (Advil®, Motrin®) or acetaminophen (Tylenol®, Tempra®).</p> <p>Breathing Problems: nasal congestion and cough (even interrupts sleep), symptoms of the 'common cold', mild asthma or wheezing that responds to usual puffers, including rescue puffers (ventolin/blue one) less than every 4 hours.</p> <p>Vomiting or diarrhea: vomiting or diarrhea less than 3 to 4 times a day; ongoing diarrhea after 'stomach flu' (this can last for up to 2 weeks).</p> <p>Injuries: minor head injuries (no loss of consciousness, no confusion, no vomiting), scrapes and bruises where the injured part can still be used and sun burns.</p> <p>Rashes: recurring rashes or skin problems; rashes with cough and cold symptoms if the child looks well, mild hives that respond to antihistamines (Reactine®).</p> |

When your child is sick, it can be hard to know what to do and how to care for them. It can also be scary.

Most illnesses can be treated at home, but knowing when you should seek medical attention is important. Remember, you can call HealthLine 811 at any time for advice.



PROVINCE BOOSTS FUNDING FOR BRIDGEPOINT CENTER FOR EATING DISORDER RECOVERY



Mental Health and Addictions Minister Tim McLeod announced a \$215,000 funding increase to expand virtual care programming at BridgePoint Center for Eating Disorder Recovery in Milden, bringing total funding to more than \$815,000 annually.

The only program of its kind in Saskatchewan, BridgePoint offers residential and virtual care programs designed to help people recover from eating disorders.

"Our government is pleased that we can support Saskatchewan residents who need treatment for eating disorders to help them heal and recover," McLeod said. "This funding helps BridgePoint expand their virtual programming, which will make their services more accessible and can save lives."

Located about one hour southwest of Saskatoon, the not-for-profit center works in partnership with the Saskatchewan Health Authority.



Big Game Draw and regular licences are available for purchase as of August 1. The quota limited antlerless mule deer licences are available on a first-come, first-served basis beginning August 15.

Hunters have a few options to purchase a licence:


- Online through the Hunting, Angling and Trapping Licence (HAL) system, 24 hours a day.
- In person at a Government of Saskatchewan field office with front counter service or at select provincial park offices.
- In person from any Saskatchewan hunting licence issuer.

- By phone at 1-855-848-4773 (you will require a credit card).

Hunters must provide their HAL identification number, or any other identification number previously added to their HAL account.


