Preparations are now underway to welcome a second humanitarian flight from Ukraine to Saskatchewan. The flight is tentatively scheduled to arrive in Saskatchewan on August 10, 2022, bringing approximately 230 additional Ukrainian citizens to the province.

"A number of community groups, organizations and individuals continue to help Ukrainian families settle into our province," Immigration and Career Training Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "Support for this important work has been awe inspiring, and we can't thank the people of Saskatchewan enough for the generosity and kindness they've shown toward Ukrainian citizens."

GOVERNMENT INCREASES SENIORS INCOME PLAN BENEFITS



Increased Funding for Seniors

For the second year in a row, the monthly benefits through the Seniors Income Plan will increase by \$30 a month. The program provides financial assistance to seniors who receive little to no income.

For the second year in a row, the maximum monthly benefit provided through the Seniors Income Plan (SIP) will increase by \$30 per month.

"Our government is following through on our commitment to make life more affordable for Saskatchewan seniors," Social Services Minister Gene Makowsky said. "This investment in the Seniors Income Plan will help seniors across the province participate in their communities while living more comfortably and securely."

The maximum SIP benefit will increase from \$300 per month to \$330 per month for singles and from \$265 per month to \$295 per month for each pensioner in a married, two-pensioner household, for a total of \$590 per month.

SASKATCHEWAN CELEBRATES STUDENT AMBASSADORS



August 2, the Government of Saskatchewan recognized 160 post-secondary students who have completed the Saskatchewan Student Ambassador Program. The program is part of the new *International Education Strategy* and provides students studying abroad and international students studying in Saskatchewan with specialized training to become global citizens and ambassadors of the province.

A total of 137 international students and 23 Saskatchewan students have completed the program since it launched on March 28, 2022.

"The Saskatchewan Student Ambassador Program is a unique opportunity that prepares post-secondary students to represent Saskatchewan across the world and brings the world to Saskatchewan," Advanced Education Minister Gordon S. Wyant said. "This program will help us continue to build international relationships and partnerships and enhance global opportunities and experiences for both Saskatchewan and international students."

SASKATCHEWAN SEEKS GREATER AUTONOMY OVER IMMIGRATION, PROPOSES SASKATCHEWAN IMMIGRATION ACCORD




July 28 Immigration and Career Training Minister Jeremy Harrison met with the federal and provincial Ministers Responsible for Immigration and put forward a detailed proposal that would give Saskatchewan similar authorities over immigration that have long been guaranteed to the Province of Quebec. The new Saskatchewan Immigration Accord would give Saskatchewan sole authority to nominate newcomers moving to Saskatchewan control over the family class of immigration, a transfer of federal resources for settlement services to the Province of Saskatchewan and a guaranteed provincial allocation of nominees each year that would be proportionate to the population of Saskatchewan within Canada.

"Saskatchewan requires more autonomy and flexibility over immigration in order to meet its economic needs and address gaps in the labour market," Immigration and Career Training Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "Canada should be focusing its efforts on reducing processing times for applications and let the provinces select immigrants and ensure their effective settlement."



CROP REPORT FOR THE PERIOD OF JULY 19 TO JULY 25, 2022



Where rain was received this past week, crops have continued with normal development, while areas in the west central region that remain very dry the crops have begun to go backwards in development and condition. Crops in areas that have received semi-regular rain showers are faring much better and some producers are expecting a better crop compared to last year. Some grain producers in the southwest and west-central regions have begun desiccating some of their pulse crops to get them ready for combining as the heat and dry conditions has shortened the growing season.

As part of their continued commitment to supporting veterans and building stronger communities, the Government of Saskatchewan is reminding service clubs that the second intake period for the Saskatchewan Veteran Service Club Support Program is open for applications.

"Our government continues to strengthen the long-term sustainability of provincial service clubs - supporting veterans, their families and communities," Parks, Culture and Sport Minister Laura Ross said. "The response to the last intake was fantastic. A total of 57 funding grants worth more than \$913,000 were provided to Legion branches, Army, Navy and Air Force Veterans (ANAVETS) units, and other registered, non-profit organizations based in Saskatchewan in the first intake period."

7.7% INCREASE IN CREDENTIALS SINCE 2017



There were 13,010 credentials awarded to Saskatchewan graduates in 2021—a record number! This is a 7.7% increase in credentials since 2017, meaning more students are graduating from post-secondary education than ever before.

The most awarded credential was a Bachelor's Degree, making up 40% of all credentials. Certificates were the second most awarded credential at 34%. Diplomas have seen the most significant growth, increasing by 40% since 2017.




