CROP REPORT FOR THE PERIOD OF JULY 24 TO JULY 31



Harvest is beginning with combines becoming a frequent site in the west-central and southwest regions of Saskatchewan. Many other areas of the province are preparing for harvest operations as the hot and dry conditions continue and the crops ripen. Producers are hoping for rain once the crops are off to help replenish soil moisture for next year.



Rain was received in the north this past week, as pockets of moisture moved through the region. Reports of hail were also received in some areas. The most rain recorded was in the Prince Albert area with 53 mm and the Shellbrook region also recorded significant moisture with 47 mm reported this week. Other areas of the province received some precipitation, with many reporting only trace amounts. Hot temperatures persisted this week, which, coupled with the lack of rain, caused a decrease in soil moisture. Provincially, cropland topsoil moisture is rated as 13 per cent adequate, 49 per cent short and 38 per cent very short. Hay and pasture land is very similar, where 11 per cent has adequate moisture, 42 per cent is short and 47 per cent is very short.



RESIDENTIAL SCHOOL MEMORIAL



The Saskatchewan Residential School Memorial is welcome to visitors all year round. Located on the grounds of Government House in Regina, the Memorial honours Indigenous children who attended residential schools and all others directly or indirectly affected by the legacy residential schools.


Lieutenant Governor Russ Mirasty and Donna Mirasty met with Elders, Knowledge Keepers, survivors, and their families, and the Memorial was created based on those discussions. The committee asked that the Memorial be made of natural elements, including benches built with reclaimed elm wood and plants native to the area. The plants form a circle around the Memorial to symbolize the circle of life.

The site's focal point is a large central stone, which the Lieutenant Governor and Donna Mirasty found near the south side of the Qu'Appelle Valley. His Honour also incorporated a smaller stone from the La Ronge area, which sits in front of the boulder and can be used for smudging.

Mounted on the boulder is a plaque made of Tyndall stone showing a map of Saskatchewan with the locations of former residential schools.

SASKATCHEWAN'S Aa (STABLE) CREDIT RATING AFFIRMED BY MOODY'S INVESTORS SERVICE



Moody's Investors Service has affirmed Saskatchewan's Aa1 (stable) credit rating and outlook.

"We are pleased that all three major rating agencies have affirmed their credit ratings for our province," Deputy Premier and Finance Minister Donna Harpauer said. "Moody's report and affirmation reflect we are headed in the right direction. Saskatchewan's financial outlook remains strong, and we will continue to be fiscally responsible by paying down debt while investing in programs and services that impact the lives of Saskatchewan people."

Saskatchewan currently has the second-highest credit rating among the provinces when all three major rating agencies are considered. In June 2023, S&P Global Ratings affirmed Saskatchewan at its highest credit rating among the provinces, and in July 2023, DBRS Morningstar affirmed Saskatchewan's AA (low) credit rating.

In their release Moody's states: "The province maintains high levels of liquidity along with a debt burden which is the lowest among provincial peers, supporting strong debt affordability and low refinancing risks."

Saskatchewan has the second lowest net-debt to GDP ratio among the provinces. Private sector forecasts have Saskatchewan experiencing real GDP growth of 1.7 per cent in 2023, the second highest amongst provinces.

Saskatchewan continues to experience strong employment, with the third lowest unemployment rate 4.7 per cent among the provinces in June, well below the national average of 5.4 per cent.

PASSING LANE PROJECT COMPLETE ON HIGHWAY 16



The \$50 million passing lane project on Highway 16 is now complete!

New passing lanes now extend from Clavet, east of Saskatoon, to the Saskatchewan/Manitoba border east of Yorkton.

As economic activity across Saskatchewan continues to grow, these new upgrades will ensure traffic moves safely and efficiently across our province.

SPEEDS IN SCHOOL AND PLAYGROUND ZONES




Where school and playground signs do not include a posted speed limit, treat the sign as a caution and pay close attention.
