And if we are to promise more, let's pledge to rest, before our bodies force us. Let's pledge to stop, and drink in life as it happens.


Let's pledge to strip away a layer of perfection to reveal the flawed and wondrous humanity we truly are inside.

Why start another year, gifted to us on this earth, with demands on our already overstrained humanity.


When we could be learning to accept, that we were always supposed to be imperfect. And that is where the beauty lives, actually. And if we can only find that beauty, we would also find peace.

SASKATCHEWAN'S QUARTERLY POPULATION GROWTH AMONG THE HIGHEST IN CANADA



Saskatchewan's population has topped 1,246,000 for the first time according to the latest quarterly population estimates released today by Statistics Canada.

There were 1,246,691 people living in Saskatchewan as of October 1, 2024 - an increase of 6,826 people over the past quarter and 26,989 people over the past year.

Saskatchewan's quarterly population increase of 0.55 per cent was the second highest among provinces and higher than the national average.

Premier Scott Moe said a growing province is a sign of a strong economy that creates more jobs and provides the services people need.

"Our government is pleased with the province's continued growth thanks to our strong economy," Moe said. "We are committed to meeting the increased demand of a growing population. Over the next four years our government is making a number of ambitious commitments to educational spaces and health care for residents. Ensuring Saskatchewan people have timely access to the right care when they need it as well as creating the most supportive environment for every student in our province to achieve at their greatest potential will be a priority for our government."

CHRISTMAS TREE DROP OFF INFORMATION



Don't send your Christmas Tree to the landfill. Take it to the City drop-off site at the Material Recovery Centre so it can be chipped and composted or used as mulch.

Drop-off Info

- Material Recovery Centre, Sort & Go
 42 Valley Road, near the landfill
- December 26 to January 31, closed January 1
 Hours of operation: 8:00am-4:45pm; 7 days a week (excluding January 1)



Reminders

- The previous community-based Christmas tree drop off sites are no longer available for use. The sites were closed as part of the Council-approved 2024/2025 Multi-Year Business Plan and Budget. Live Christmas trees can only be dropped off at the temporary depot at the Material Recovery Centre (MRC), located at 42 Valley Road, Saskatoon.
- Live (natural) trees only. Artificial trees should be sold, donated, or disposed of at the Landfill.
- Trees should be unwrapped and unbound.

- Remove all decorations, ornaments, and plastic bags before dropping off your tree. Even small bits of tinsel or plastic can impact the quality of the wood chips.
- The City will not pick up trees from back lanes, street fronts or curbside collection carts.
- Small twigs and tree trimmings that are no more than 60 centimetres in length and 2 centimetres in diameter are accepted in the green cart.
