TELEROBOTICS ULTRASOUND SYSTEM TO IMPROVE
PRENATAL AND PEDIATRIC CARE ACROSS SASKATCHEWAN



Last week I had the exciting opportunity on behalf of Premier Scott Moe, Rural and Remote Health Minister Everett Hindley, and the Government of Saskatchewan to announce a new research initiative and show a live demonstration of the telerobotics ultrasound system that will improve prenatal and pediatric care across Saskatchewan.

Gravelbourg is now home to cutting-edge diagnostic technology. St. Joseph's Hospital recently received a telerobotic ultrasound machine which allows for a sonographer to perform an ultrasound virtually.

Introducing technology like this in communities across Saskatchewan will not only improve access to diagnostic services but will greatly reduce the time patients spend travelling to and from important medical appointments in rural and remote communities.

"The telerobotic ultrasound research initiative lead by Dr. Mendez and his team is making innovative strives for health care delivery to families in our province," said Brynn Boback-Lane, CEO & President,

Jim Pattison Children's Hospital Foundation. "Jim Pattison Children's Hospital Foundation is proud to partner with the Saskatchewan Health Authority, the Virtual Care and Robotics Program, and St. Joseph's Hospital, as we work together to enhance prenatal and pediatric patient care throughout Saskatchewan."

I had the pleasure to extend a special thank you to Dr. Mendez and the health care team pioneering this important work that is directly benefitting residents across the province. Thank you as well to the Jim Pattison Children's Hospital Foundation, AdEchoTech and the virtual care and robotics program for funding this system for the community of Gravelbourg. The deployment of this state-of-the-art technology will not only help improve patient care but improve our healthcare system for everyone.

As you may know, Saskatchewan has a four-point Health Human Resources Action plan to <u>recruit</u>, <u>train</u>, <u>incentivize</u> and <u>retain</u> more health care workers to support the important health care services that communities across the provinces rely on. This initiative will amount to over \$60 million over the next several years. In addition to recruiting more health care professionals, it is also important to look at innovative options with the resources we already have. It is exciting to see Saskatchewan at the forefront of this technology.



## ADDITIONAL FUNDING CREATES NEW EMERGENCY SHELTER SPACES



Following an additional \$1.7 million investment from the Government of Saskatchewan in November 2022, new temporary emergency shelter spaces were created across the province to ensure people in need of shelter had a warm place to stay during the winter months.


The additional funding was provided to help emergency shelters better meet seasonal pressures. Since this announcement was made, the ministry has collaborated with community partners to develop 83 new temporary shelter spaces. The spaces will be operational until April 30, 2023.

"Our government provided additional funding to emergency shelters to expand capacity during the winter months," Social Services Minister Gene Makowsky said. "Through the hard work and commitment of our community partners, we were able to secure these additional spaces to better support people in need."

Of the additional \$1.7 million investment, \$800,000 was provided as a one-time grant to help emergency shelters and wellness centres across Saskatchewan meet seasonal cost pressures, and \$900,000 went toward creating additional temporary shelter spaces in Saskatoon, Regina and Prince Albert.

## MORE HEALTH CARE WORKERS ON TRACK TO JOIN SASKATCHEWAN'S HEALTH CARE SYSTEM



Plan is seeing steady progress in all

areas of focus.

Saskatchewan continues to make progress in attracting and recruiting health care workers from home and abroad as part of the province's Health Human Resources (HHR) Action Plan to recruit, train, incentivize and retain health care professionals.

"Sustained work continues under the four pillars of Saskatchewan's ambitious HHR Action Plan, and I am pleased to see steady progress in all areas of focus," Health Minister Paul Merriman said. "As we start a new year, I look forward to more actions to build on the successes we have had so far. It's important we continue to spread the word that Saskatchewan is an outstanding place to build and grow your health care career."

Registered Nurses (RNs) from the Philippines who received conditional offers have begun working their way through the RN Pathway which includes language, bridging education and licensing. A full staff complement of health recruitment and retention navigators are now in place and have sent a survey to over 1,000 participants who attended in-person sessions in Manila to learn more about their experience. These navigators will assist all potential international recruits with the steps and processes needed to gain employment in Saskatchewan's health care system.

## MORE THAN \$500,000 INVESTED TOWARD 15 NEW MUNICIPAL PROJECTS TO STRENGTHEN COMMUNITIES

Projects include developing a land use plan in the RM of Paddockwood north of Prince Albert, producing a shared policy manual for municipal officials in various west-central communities, and creating a regional emergency plan in the Lanigan area in central Saskatchewan.

"Our government is proud of its ongoing work and relationships with Saskatchewan's municipal associations to make this initiative happen," McMorris said. "Together, we will help communities better serve their citizens by strengthening local governments across this great province."



## GOVERNMENT ANNOUNCES \$44 MILLION IN NEW GRANTS FOR CHILD CARE FACILITIES



The Governments of Saskatchewan and Canada announce three new, one-time grants to support regulated early learning and child care centres and homes across the province. The \$44 million investment in one-time grants aims to help offset costs incurred from inflation, support preventative maintenance and repairs of centres, and provide funding for outdoor winter play equipment.

"This additional funding helps ensure our regulated early learning and child care centres and homes continue to operate safe, modern facilities while encouraging young children to grow, learn and play," Education Minister Dustin Duncan said. "Investing in our next generation is investing in Saskatchewan's future growth, and that is growth that works for everyone."

# \$44 Million in New Grants for Child Care Facilities

New grants will support regulated early learning and child care centres and homes across the province.



The operating grant to offset inflation costs will provide \$15 million to regulated centres and homes across the province. Centres and homes will receive approximately \$750 per eligible regulated child care space with this grant.

The preventative maintenance and repair grant totals a \$27 million investment to assist in the proactive maintenance of regulated centres' structural, plumbing, electrical and mechanical systems to prolong the life of facilities. Grant amounts range from \$1,600 per space to \$3,200 per space dependent upon space type and facility's location within the province.

The winter season grant totaling \$2 million will provide regulated centres and homes with funding of \$100 per space to purchase equipment and materials to encourage outdoor physical activity and winter play.

More information on the new grants, including eligibility and application forms, will be distributed to regulated child care centres and homes by the Ministry of Education Early Years branch in the coming days.

"We want the best possible start in life for all children in Canada," Canada's Minister of Families Children and Social Development Karina Gould said. "These grants will help ensure child care providers can continue to provide access to high-quality, affordable, flexible and inclusive early learning and child care across the province."

The funding for all three one-time grants is provided through the Canada-Saskatchewan Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care Agreement signed in August 2021, which provides a federal investment of nearly \$1.1 billion over five years to support access to high-quality, inclusive, affordable, and flexible programs and services for children under the age of six in Saskatchewan.

# Expanding Health Care Training Opportunities

Saskatchewan is adding over 550 new post-secondary training seats across 18 health care programs.

Saskatchewan is dramatically increasing educational opportunities for Saskatchewan students and young adults interested in health careers. An immediate initial investment of more than \$5.5 million will help create over 550 new post-secondary training seats across 18 health care training programs.

Expanding health training programs is one of four pillars in the province's <u>Health Human Resources</u>

<u>Action Plan</u>. This commitment will increase training capacity at the province's post-secondary institutions and reserve additional training seats for Saskatchewan students in highly specialized programs in other provinces.

"This initiative will open up exciting new health career options for many more Saskatchewan students by giving them greater access to training for their career of choice," Advanced Education Minister Gordon Wyant said. "The scale of this unprecedented expansion of Saskatchewan's health training capacity demonstrates our government's commitment to strengthening our health care workforce. We are grateful for the support of our partners across the post-secondary education and health sectors."

#### Backgrounder

Saskatchewan's <u>Health Human Resources Action Plan</u> is based on four critical areas necessary to meet the province's health human resource needs: **Recruit, Train, Incentivize** and **Retain**. It recognizes the need to expand health care training opportunities. Eighteen health occupations have been identified as immediate priorities to help address chronic and urgent vacancies in key health professions.




#### **INCENTIVES FOR HEALTH-CARE EMPLOYEES**



Since its introduction last fall, a total of 31 packages have been approved to new health-care workers in full-time permanent positions for the Rural and Remote Recruitment Incentive available in 52 Saskatchewan locations for up to \$50,000 for three-year return-in-service agreement.

PROPOSED "JUST TRANSITION" LEGISLATION

#### Statement from Bronwyn Eyre

on Proposed "Just Transition" Legislation

There are more questions than answers regarding the federal government's proposed "Just Transition" legislation.

While our expectation is that the federal government has taken into account Saskatchewan's feedback and perspective, we won't know until the legislation is tabled this spring.

Until that time, what we can say as a government to Saskatchewan's workers and to Saskatchewan's industries is this: we have your back.

There are over 70,000 people directly and indirectly employed by our agriculture and energy sectors – sectors which are vital to not only our province, but also to our country and indeed the world. Our agriculture sector is the most sustainable in the world, producing more product and doing so with fewer emissions. The same goes for our energy sector, which continues to innovate the extraction and refinement of oil and gas, responsibly and ethically.

The men and women in these sectors are literally working to put food on the table and keep the lights on. At a time when governments in every jurisdiction are working to provide food and energy security, we expect that the federal government has taken into account our sectors' ability to provide just that.

While we will be watching the federal government's next moves very closely, any legislation that eliminates jobs or that reduces output of the most sustainable products in the world will not be accepted by Saskatchewan and will be met with the tools we have available to protect and preserve both our jobs and our future.
