It was a pleasure to attend the Willowgrove University Heights Brighton Community Association meeting this past Tuesday.


I had the opportunity to present an MLA report including several topics:

Saskatchewan is the most attractive jurisdiction in Canada for oil and gas investment, according to the Fraser Institute's 2023 Canada-US Energy Sector Competitiveness Survey. Overall, Saskatchewan ranked third in the survey out of 17 competing jurisdictions.


"Saskatchewan continues to assert itself as a reliable energy investment jurisdiction," Energy and Resources Minister Jim Reiter said. "Our government will continue to fight for, and support, the

jobs and growth that 26,000 energy workers and their families in Saskatchewan have come to rely on. We look forward to further improving our investment attraction in the years to come."

The province is the highest-ranked province and the only Canadian region to break the top five, with Alberta and British Columbia coming in ninth and 15th, respectively. This continues the province's upward growth among jurisdictions in Canada and the United States (US) after ranking sixth in 2022, and 11th the year prior.

THREE PUBLIC SAFETY AGENCIES TEAM UP FOR NEW EMERGENCY RESPONSE VEHICLE



The Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency (SPSA), the Regina Police Service (RPS) and Regina Fire and Protective Services (RFPS) unveiled a new emergency vehicle as well as a new partnership between the three agencies.



The Mobile Command Post (MCP) is a customized 37-foot, self-propelled unit that can be dispatched to incidents and act as the central command, or the main hub, for public safety staff at an event. The vehicle is equipped with multiple tools and resources that assist personnel during an incident, including radio communications, weather forecasting equipment and various video devices.

It is illegal to give or sell TOBACCO or VAPOUR PRODUCTS to anyone under 19 years of age.

Effective February 1, 2024, the minimum age for the purchase of tobacco and vapour products will increase from 18 to 19 years of age.

In October 2023, the Government of Saskatchewan passed proposed legislation calling for the increase in the minimum age for tobacco and vapour product purchases. The legislative change aligns tobacco and vaping product restrictions with alcohol and cannabis.

"It is important for us to protect Saskatchewan youth from the dangers of tobacco and vapour products," Health Minister Everett Hindley said. "These products have no place in Saskatchewan schools and I'm pleased that MLAs on both sides of the house voted unanimously to take the necessary steps to protect students from being exposed to these products."



THE SASKATCHEWAN EMPLOYMENT INCENTIVE IS NOW OPEN FOR APPLICATIONS



The Government of Saskatchewan has officially launched the new Saskatchewan Employment Incentive (SEI). Working families with low incomes can now apply online at saskatchewan.ca/employment-incentive.

Working parents earning between \$500 and \$2,200 per month may be eligible for the maximum monthly SEI benefit ranging from \$400 to \$600, depending on the number of children they have.

"Our government is making life more affordable for Saskatchewan families," Social Services Minister Gene Makowsky said. "The Saskatchewan Employment Incentive helps low-income families choose and maintain employment by helping them with essential costs such as transportation, clothing and child care."

- 1. Business name, address, and telephone number.
- 2. Clear description of exactly what you are purchasing.
- 3. Clear description of any additional charges that may apply.
- 4. The currency in which the amount owing is payable.
- 5. Terms, conditions, and method of payment.
- 6. Cancellation, return, exchange, and refund policies (if any).
- 7. Confirm that you will receive a copy of the contract in writing or electronic form, including any information disclosed to you, your name, and the date the contract was entered into.
- 8. Before giving a credit card number or other financial information, ensure the website has a secure transaction system.

CROWN LAND GRAZING RATES FROZENFOR 2024



The Government of Saskatchewan is freezing the 2024 Crown land grazing rate at 2022 levels, as the industry continues to deal with the effects of several years of dry conditions. Producers who must reduce their stocking rates on leased Crown land due to drought will also again be eligible for a rent reduction.

"The beef cattle sector continues to experience challenges with tight margins and ongoing concerns related to multiple years of dry conditions," Agriculture Minister David Marit said.

"Producers are valuable stewards of Saskatchewan's grasslands. Maintaining rates at the existing level, and offering a reduction in some scenarios, will help producers plan for 2024."

- Clear your sidewalk and put down de-icer/sand/salt if you notice ice build up





Watch for Pavement Frost These types of temps create conditions for black ice, which can create treacherous driving conditions When cold air circulates above and below the surface, like bridges and overpasses, black ice can form.

WATCH FOR PAVEMENT FROST

With warmer weather expected this week, there is a risk of pavement frost, especially when temperatures rise to near zero.

When warm pavement temperatures are combined with colder air, there is a chance ice can form on the road surface. This can cause a build-up of frost that can make roads slick.




