

This year especially, we think of all Ukrainian friends and pray for peace in their country. We welcome all Ukrainians that are now calling Saskatchewan home.



REPORT FROM THE LEGISLATURE

As the new year begins, Saskatchewan's economy continues to lead the nation. Despite global economic uncertainty, private companies continue to invest their dollars in Saskatchewan industries. Significant investments in energy, forestry, technology and agriculture will create jobs and opportunities in Saskatchewan throughout the new year and into the future.

BHP is accelerating the timeline on its \$12 billion Jansen potash mine, the largest single investment in Saskatchewan history. This investment brings total capital investment in the province's potash industry to \$30 billion since 2007. The mine is expected to be operational in 2027 and will provide over 600 direct jobs at the mine site and at the corporate office in Saskatoon.

Saskatchewan's mining industry also has the unique opportunity to position itself as a leader in lithium production. Global lithium demand is expected to grow significantly in the next decade as it is used in portable electronic devices and electric vehicles. Prairie Lithium and Grounded Lithium have both invested in drilling for lithium in the province. As drilling continues in the province, Saskatchewan can expect growth in the technology, mining and energy sectors as well as job creation.

Investments by several agricultural companies have helped Saskatchewan maintain and grow its agricultural advantage. Federated Cooperatives Limited is moving forward with its Integrated Agriculture Complex, including a renewable diesel facility and canola crushing plant in partnership with AGT Foods. The renewable diesel plant, which will be the largest of its kind in Canada, represents nearly \$2 billion in capital investment, plus 2,500 construction jobs and 150 operating jobs. The entire project will have estimated economic benefits of \$4.5 billion.

Cargill's \$350 million canola processing facility in Regina broke ground in July and will be operational by 2024. This investment alone will generate approximately one million hours of employment throughout construction and create 50 full-time positions upon completion. The Viterra canola crushing plant will also be operational by 2024, creating another 1,000 construction jobs and 100 permanent positions.

Finally, as part of the Growth Plan goal to double the growth of the province's forestry sector, Government announced timber allocations to support four major forestry projects. Pivot Furniture, a Saskatchewan-based company, was awarded a timber allocation of 101,000 cubic metres. Between 2021 and 2024 the forestry industry is expected to attract \$1 billion in capital investment and create 3,100 jobs. The sector already supports over 8,000 jobs in the province.

The confidence of private investors demonstrates the momentum in our economy as we look to the year ahead. Economic forecasters predict resilience and prosperity for the province in 2023. The future is bright and it's a great time to live, work and raise your family in Saskatchewan.

SERIOUS INCIDENT RESPONSETEAM (SIRT) OPERATONAL IN SASKATCHEWAN



On January 1, *The Police (Serious Incident Response Team) Amendment Act, 2021* came into force, which formally establishes a serious incident response team (SIRT) in Saskatchewan.

"These changes will allow the SIRT to engage in any serious incident involving police, from initiating a full investigation to reviewing, overseeing, assisting or delegating one," Minister of Justice and Attorney General Bronwyn Eyre said. "The Act coming into force completes the transition to a civilian-led, independent police oversight body and brings Saskatchewan's police oversight regime into line with most other Canadian jurisdictions."

Acting under the Civilian Executive Director, SIRT members will investigate matters where serious injury or death may have occurred while in the custody of police, as a result of the actions of a police officer, or where sexual assault or interpersonal violence involving police are alleged. Other investigations may also be conducted where the Executive Director believes they are in the public interest. SIRT can also assume conduct of an ongoing investigation at any stage.

"The people of Saskatchewan rightly hold their police officers to a high standard," Public Complaints Commission Executive Director Greg Gudelot said. "A fully-operational SIRT ensures that serious incidents involving Saskatchewan police will be investigated through an independent and transparent process designed to ensure a fair and high-quality investigation for all those involved."

SIRT investigations will apply to municipal police officers and RCMP operating in Saskatchewan, as well as certain prescribed classes of special constables, such as Highway Traffic Patrol and Conservation officers.

The legislation also requires SIRT to include Indigenous representation by appointing a First Nations or Métis community liaison officer in matters where the individual involved is of First Nations or Métis ancestry. Appointed liaisons can provide assistance to the Executive Director in a variety of forms throughout the investigation. The Executive Director has the discretion to appoint a community liaison in all other matters.

Summaries of SIRT investigations will be published online to ensure transparency in the investigation process and provide the public with informative results.

Saskatoon Christmas Tree Compost Drop-off — Dec 26 - Jan 31, 2023

Live (natural) trees only. Artificial trees should be sold, donated, or disposed of at the Landfill. Trees
should be unwrapped and unbound. Remove all decorations, ornaments, and plastic bags before
dropping off your tree. Even small bits of tinsel or plastic can impact the quality of the wood
chips. The City will not pick up trees from back lanes, street fronts, or garbage and recycling carts.

STRONG GROWTH FOR SASKATCHEWAN'S MERCHANDISE EXPORTS



Saskatchewan's economy remains one of the strongest in the nation, with November 2022 merchandise exports seeing a 44.5 per cent increase compared to November 2021. This is the second highest increase among provinces. Total merchandise exports for November 2022 were valued at more than \$5 billion.

"We have a secure and stable supply chain in Saskatchewan, providing the food, fuel, fertilizer and critical minerals that a growing world needs," Trade and Export Development Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "Our government remains committed to supporting and expanding our export sectors in order to create jobs, generate wealth and attract investment to our province."




Winter Programming 2023 Registration is now open! Registration closes January 8th at 8pm!

WINTER IN THE CITY



Bundle up and experience Saskatchewan's cities in the snowy season. With countless outdoor skating rinks, cross-country ski trails and opportunities for downhill skiing and snowboarding, the province's urban centres have all you need to warm up to winter.

Lace up some skates and take to the ice at the <u>Cameco Meewasin Skating Rink @ Nutrien Plaza</u>, located in Kiwanis Park next to the historic <u>Delta Hotels by Marriott Bessborough</u>. The outdoor skating rink has a cosy warm-up shelter, fire pit, washrooms and skates available to borrow.

Optimist Hill, Saskatoon's premier winter recreation facility, has tubing lanes and areas for tobogganing, downhill skiing and snowboarding. There is also a terrain park with rails, boxes and jumps, and a magic carpet conveyor to carry people to the top of the hill.

The <u>Meewasin Valley</u> trails become a winter wonderland once the snow flies. Pull out your cross-country skis or snowshoes and explore the city in all seasons. Glide along the groomed trails at Holiday Park and Wildwood golf courses, or venture outside of city limits to <u>Wanuskewin Heritage Park</u>, <u>Beaver Creek Conservation Area</u> or <u>Dakota Dunes Resort & Casino</u>. Other guided winter experiences at the resort include horse-drawn sleigh rides, snowshoe adventures, bird tours and ice fishing.


