On the first Monday of August, the Civic/Provincial Day has a different significance in the different provinces of Canada. The Minister of Labour Gordon Snyder first proposed Saskatchewan Day. The holiday first came into regulation on 17th March 1975. Business sectors were already celebrating the holiday but Snyder wanted it as a statutory holiday. In June 1975 the day was first approved and a few weeks later it took place.

REPORT FROM THE LEGISLATURE



Saskatchewan's economy is moving forward with significant strength, and our government is working hard to promote the local business climate and investment opportunities. Figures released in recent weeks show our province leading in several key economic indicators once again.

The value of wholesale trade increased by 44 per cent between May 2021 and May 2022, leading all provinces in growth. To provide some context, Alberta saw the second highest increase at 20.6 per cent. Saskatchewan has the resources and products the world wants and needs.

That positive business climate has translated into some solid employment figures. The Statistics Canada June report shows that Saskatchewan now has more people working than ever. Data shows that 22,300 jobs were added to the province over the last year, resulting in a record high of 592,900 jobs. Unemployment fell to 3.9 per cent, the second lowest among the provinces and the lowest since November 2014.

More jobs will soon be coming to our province after a significant announcement from BHP. The

international company has announced their Jansen potash mine will be ready for production in 2026 rather than 2027. The project is expected to need 600 miners; and Brandt Industries also announced this month they will be looking to hire 200 employees for their new manufacturing facility in the City of Moose Jaw.

Another economic performance indicator is in the latest housing starts report. Once again, Saskatchewan is one of the top performing provinces, with an 87 per cent increase in urban housing starts between June 2021 and June 2022. This was the second highest year-over-year growth in Canada.

Our continued economic success and opportunity for future sustainable growth have caught the attention of two more major credit rating organizations. Moody's Investor Services has maintained Saskatchewan's Aa1 credit rating, reflecting a strong financial picture. DBRS Morningstar also confirmed their AA credit rating for the province. In their report they stated, "the elected government has long demonstrated commitment to a pro-growth agenda, a low and competitive tax regime, balanced budget and low debt." This is a continuation of S&P Global Ratings who affirmed Saskatchewan's AA credit rating and stable outlook in June of this year. The credit reports are another endorsement of Saskatchewan's sound fiscal policy and direction.

Our government recognizes that inflation and the cost of living are top of mind for Saskatchewan families. Recently, we announced school divisions would receive a one-time investment of \$20 million to assist with rising fuel and insurance costs for the 2022-23 school year. This boost will allow divisions to address inflationary costs rather than diverting resources from the classroom. With this additional investment, school operating funding will exceed \$2 billion for the first time in provincial history.

In addition to measures like reduced child care costs, the second lowest utility bundle in Canada and maintaining one of the highest tax-free thresholds in the country, we continue to look for ways to make life more affordable here in Saskatchewan. As the fiscal year continues, we will review the financial picture in the coming months and make necessary adjustments to support Saskatchewan residents.

GOVERNMENT OF SASKATCHEWAN BOOSTING EDUCATION BUDGET BY \$20 MILLION TO ASSIST SCHOOL DIVISIONS WITH FUEL AND INSURANCE COSTS



The Government of Saskatchewan is providing Saskatchewan's school divisions with a one-time investment of \$20 million in funding for the 2022-23 school year to assist with rising fuel and insurance costs.

As a result of these additional funds, school divisions will be able to prevent inflationary costs from diverting resources away from classrooms.

"Our government recognizes the impacts rising costs across the country have on our schools and we are committed to ensuring every Saskatchewan student and teacher has the supports needed to achieve success in the classroom," Education Minister Dustin Duncan said. "Now that school board budgets have been submitted, we have weighed the impact of fuel and insurance costs on their operations and are in a position to provide further assistance to divisions."

Priority for immunocompromised children

With Health Canada's approval of Moderna's COVID-19 vaccine for children six months up to five years, vaccination clinics will start this week.

Saskatchewan will be receiving a limited supply of approximately 13,000 doses of the vaccine in its first delivery, so the appointments will open first to those children at highest risk of severe COVID-19 outcomes.

Priority is being given to children age six months up to five years who are moderately to severely immunocompromised.

BHP TO SPEED UP \$5.7 BILLION JANSEN POTASH MINE



What will be the largest potash mine in the world is one year closer to beginning operations in Saskatchewan. Originally expected to start production in 2027, BHP has announced their \$7.34 billion Jansen potash mine will be operational in 2026. Around 600 miners are expected to be hired as part of the new project east of Saskatoon.



5,000 MORE SURGERIES DELIVERED IN FIRST FIVE MONTHS OF 2022 THAN IN 2021

Saskatchewan's surgical system is striving to achieve aggressive targets and is making progress in ramping up volumes and providing surgeries to patients who need them most.

During the first five months of 2022, the health system delivered 5,000 more surgeries than during the preceding five months in 2021 when services had been slowed down. In addition, during the first five months of 2022, there was a 2,500 increase in the number of surgeries performed on patients who had already waited over six months.

As surgical services continue to ramp up, there are efforts to focus resources on those waiting longest, and also catch up on procedures most affected by service slowdowns such as hip and knee

replacements, back surgeries, and ear/nose/throat procedures. New strategies are being considered to increase hip and knee replacements.

"This progress is a result of the hard work and dedication shown by our provincial surgical teams to serve patients and increase surgical volumes," Health Minister Paul Merriman said. "Their efforts have made a positive impact on quality of life for many Saskatchewan people and their families."

\$120 Million Highway Safety Project Nears Completion

Highway 7 is a busy corridor connecting the largest cities in Saskatchewan and Alberta.

Since 2014, major safety upgrades have been made between Saskatoon and the provincial border including twinning and passing lanes.


A multi-year series of highway safety improvements is nearing completion on Highway 7. The latest upgrades include passing lanes between Kindersley and the Saskatchewan-Alberta border. Since 2014, the Government of Saskatchewan has invested about \$120 million on major safety improvements on Highway 7 between Saskatoon and the interprovincial boundary.

"The Ministry of Highways has a long-term strategy that will improve safety, increase capacity and support economic growth," Highways Minister Jeremy Cockrill said. "Our government is following through

on its commitments through strategic investments in key corridors such as Highway 7."

TAXPAYERS' FAIRNESS (CPR) ACT COMES INTO FORCE



July 22, the provincial government brings into force the *Taxpayers' Fairness (CPR) Act*, which was passed in the spring session of the Legislature with unanimous support.

This Act supplements two other recently passed pieces of legislation: the *Constitution Amendment* (Saskatchewan Act), 2022, passed by Saskatchewan's Legislative Assembly, the House of Commons, and the Senate; and provisions in the federal *Budget Implementation Act, 2000*, passed by Parliament in late June.

"We always want to ensure that the people of Saskatchewan receive their fair share from companies doing business in our province," Minister of Justice and Attorney General Bronwyn Eyre said. "The argument that any company is exempt from taxation is unfair to taxpayers and other businesses that operate here."

CROP REPORT JULY 12-18



Crops continue to advance quickly throughout the province due to hot, humid days over the past few weeks. The humidity has slowed haying. When humidity is high, cutting hay becomes more challenging and hay that is cut does not dry down as quickly which can result in lower quality feed. Canola across the province has suffered from the heat and humidity. Many producers are reporting that their crops have experienced heat blasting and are worried about the effect it will have on their yields. If the heat continues with minimal rainfall, crops will be ready for harvest sooner than normal, similar to the 2021 harvest. Many areas in the province experienced wild weather systems this past week with hail, thunderstorms and even tornados occurring leaving crops, buildings and trees damaged.

Provincially, 74 per cent of the fall cereals, 65 per cent of the spring cereals, 61 per cent of the oilseeds and 74 per cent of the pulse crops are at their normal stages of development for this time of year. Producers have indicated that cereals are heading out and are hopeful that the head will fill now that moisture is adequate in many areas. Canola is flowering and podding throughout the province.


NOTICE - STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

PROTECTING OUR FORESTS FROM DUTCH ELM DISEASE



Dutch elm disease (DED) puts Saskatchewan's urban and rural forests at risk, especially in the eastern half of the province. Slowing the spread of DED is a critical part of forest health.

To support the 2022-23 DED program, the Ministry of Environment has contracted Regina-based Northern Tree Co. Inc., to remove and dispose of infected elm trees in high-risk areas. Early detection and prompt removal of diseased American elm trees is key to slow the spread of this disease.

"Dutch elm disease is an ongoing concern for Saskatchewan residents and wildlife," Environment Minister Dana Skoropad said. "We are pleased to continue working with a local company on this important initiative to protect and maintain our urban and rural forests."

HELP PROTECT OUR WATERS: STOP AT WATERCRAFT INSPECTION STATIONS



Remember to stop at all provincial watercraft inspection stations to help prevent the introduction of aquatic invasive species (AIS) into Saskatchewan waters. While travelling across provincial and international borders, look for inspection stations along highways and near waterbodies.

Watercraft inspection is mandatory in Saskatchewan - even if you are just passing through. We work with neighbouring provinces, states and the Canada Border Services Agency to coordinate inspection efforts. So far, Saskatchewan has been successful in preventing the introduction and establishment of AIS.

Remember: Inspection is required for more than boats! A watercraft is anything you ride, including paddle boards, kayaks, canoes, sailboats and jet skis.




