S&P GLOBAL RATINGS AFFIRMS SASKATCHEWAN'S AA RATING



S&P Global Ratings has affirmed Saskatchewan's AA credit rating and stable outlook. With this affirmation, Saskatchewan continues to have the second highest credit rating among Canadian provinces when all three major rating agencies (Moody's, DBRS Morningstar, and S&P) are considered.

"Our government is pleased that S&P has affirmed our rating," Deputy Premier and Finance Minister Donna Harpauer said. "Our strong financial plan has Saskatchewan back on track. Our 2022-23 Budget shows improvement to the bottom line and a path to balance by 2026-27."

In it' release S&P states that, "the stable outlook reflects our expectation that in the next two years the provincial economy will expand and Saskatchewan's prudent financial management will help its

budgetary performance improve towards balanced operating results while maintaining strong liquidity levels."

Saskatchewan is poised to be a leader in economic growth among the provinces in 2022, according to private sector forecasts, based on continued high commodity prices, increased private sector investment and a return to a more normal year for agriculture.

Through the first three months of 2022, Saskatchewan posted the highest growth in wholesale trade, at 38.1 per cent, and the highest growth in manufacturing sales, at 37.0 per cent, among the provinces. In that time Saskatchewan also posted the second-highest employment rate, 63.5 per cent, and third highest growth in retail sales, 8.2 per cent, among the provinces.

19,800 jobs gained year-over-year

June 10, job numbers released by Statistics Canada for May 2022 show Saskatchewan added 19,800 jobs, an increase of 3.5 per cent, compared to May 2021. All of the growth was in full-time jobs.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate fell to 4.8 per cent in May 2022. It was down from 6.1 per cent a year ago, down from 5.5 per cent a month ago, and below the national average of 5.1 per cent.

"Saskatchewan's economy is on the right track with significant job gains and a low unemployment rate," Immigration and Career Training Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "Our government will continue to provide a competitive environment to accelerate our economic growth in communities across the province."

It was a pleasure to attend the Canada West Foundation dinner and discussion held at the Saskatoon Club last week.

The demand for what Saskatchewan produces – oil, potash, grain, peas and lentils, canola oil and processed plant-based protein – are all taking off. Over the past three years, Saskatchewan exports have increased 32 per cent, almost three times as fast as exports from the rest of Canada. Ag products are up 42 per cent, energy 26 per cent and minerals 43 per cent. Clearly, Saskatchewan produces what the world wants. In particular, it has what its two leading trade partners, the U.S. and China, want.

SASKATCHEWAN TO ADVANCE AGRICULTURE INVESTMENT
AND EXPORT OPPORTUNITIES IN THE UNITED STATES



Saskatchewan Minister of Agriculture David Marit will travel to Denver, Colorado and Minneapolis, Minnesota to promote Saskatchewan as a reliable supplier of high-quality agricultural products, advance investment and collaborative opportunities in the province's value-added sector and further develop relationships with stakeholders. The delegation leaves for the five-day trade mission on June 12.

The mission will focus on canola, wheat, oats, malting barley, pulses and cattle, and highlight Saskatchewan's research and innovation capabilities. The mission will also expand and strengthen Saskatchewan's research and investment ties with the United States through meetings with industry, academia and government.

"The United States is Saskatchewan's top agri-food export market and it makes sense to work together on matters of mutual interest for our agriculture and food industries, including sustainability and the Canada-United States-Mexico-Agreement," Marit said. "This mission will allow us to meet with a number of our long-standing American partners and help us to showcase the world-leading agricultural practices used here in Saskatchewan that support our shared goals of meeting the challenge of global food security. We are committed to enhancing our existing relationships and forging new ones with our American stakeholders."

<u>Ukrainians arriving in Saskatchewan</u> will face one less headache thanks to a new move by SGI.

The provincial insurer announced Wednesday that it will allow the exchange of Ukrainian driver's licences for Saskatchewan licences.

Going forward, anyone holding a Ukrainian "category B passenger vehicle licence" can exchange it for the equivalent, a Saskatchewan Class 5 licence.


A driver's abstract or driving record, normally a requirement for a licence exchange, will not be required for Ukrainians due to the situation in their war-torn home country. The policy doesn't apply to licences for motorcycles or commercial vehicles.

"We are doing what we can to alleviate some of the challenges faced by people displaced by the war in Ukraine as they relocate to our province," SGI CEO Penny McCune said in a statement.

The decision follows a similar move by Manitoba Public Insurance. SGI said Manitoba's in-depth analysis of Ukrainian driver education requirements and standards was shared to help inform SGI's decision.

SGI holds licence exchange agreements with 16 other countries.

SASKATCHEWAN STUDENTS - NOTICE



If you're a student with a permanent, persistent, or long-term disability, Check this out!

Disability supports have been expanded for the 2022-23 academic year for students with permanent, persistent or prolonged disabilities. Students may be eligible for the following grants:

- 1) The Canada-Saskatchewan Grant for Services and Equipment for Students with Disabilities grant provides up to \$22,000 per program year to purchase specialized education-related services and assistive equipment.
- 2) The Canada Student Grant for Students with Disabilities provides \$4,000 per school year to assist with educational or living costs.

JUNE IS INDIGENOUS HISTORY MONTH




Outside the police station in Saskatoon is a statue of a dancing girl.





5THINGS TO DO INSTEAD OF COMPLAIN

- 1. Practice Gratitude. Research shows that when we count three blessings a day, we get a measurable boost in happiness that uplifts and energizes us. It's also physiologically impossible to be stressed and thankful at the same time. Two thoughts cannot occupy our mind at the same time. If you are focusing on gratitude, you can't be negative. You can also energize and engage your coworkers by letting them know you are grateful for them and their work.
- 2. Praise Others. Instead of complaining about what others are doing wrong, start focusing on what they are doing right. Praise them and watch as they create more success as a result. Of course, point out their mistakes so they can learn and grow, but make sure you give three times as much praise as criticism.
- 3. Focus on Success. Start a success journal. Each night before you go to bed, write down the one great thing about your day. The one great conversation, accomplishment, or win that you are most proud of. Focus on your success, and you'll look forward to creating more success tomorrow.

- 5. Pray and Meditate. Scientific research shows that these daily practices reduce stress; boost positive energy; and promote health, vitality, and longevity. When you are faced with the urge to complain or you are feeling stressed to the max, stop, be still, plug-in to the ultimate power, and recharge.
