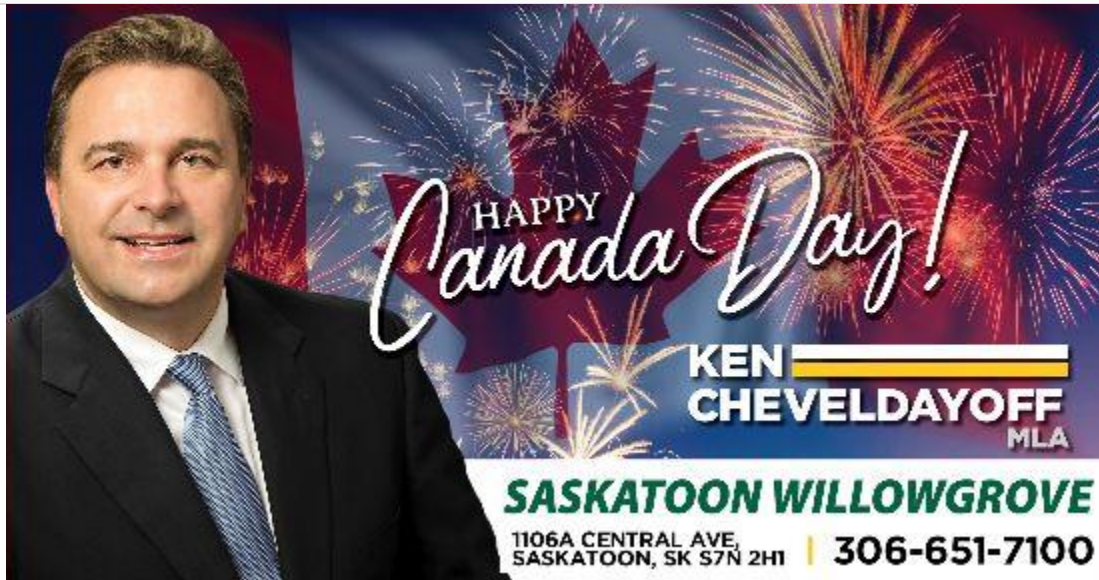

GOVERNMENT OF SASKATCHEWAN PROVIDES ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR SRC RARE EARTH PROCESSING FACILITY EXPANSION



June 23, the Government of Saskatchewan announced an additional \$20 million in funding for the Saskatchewan Research Council's (SRC) Rare Earth Processing facility. The funding will allow the Facility to expand its capabilities and move further down the Rare Earth Element (REE) value chain with

the addition of a metals unit that will produce rare earth metals, a key ingredient used to manufacture permanent magnets. The funding will also address increased costs in the project that have arisen over the past two years as a result of various global supply chain challenges.

The facility will be the first-of-its-kind in North America and is already beginning to establish a vertically integrated REE supply chain in Saskatchewan, forming an industry model for future commercial REE resource expansion in the province.

"The SRC Rare Earth Processing Facility delivers on a key element of the 2030 Growth Plan, with the planned expansion into metals production exceeding our original objective," Minister Responsible for SRC Jeremy Harrison said. "Our government is proud to provide our continued support to a facility that is enhancing domestic production to reduce reliance on foreign imports and supporting economic growth in this burgeoning sector."

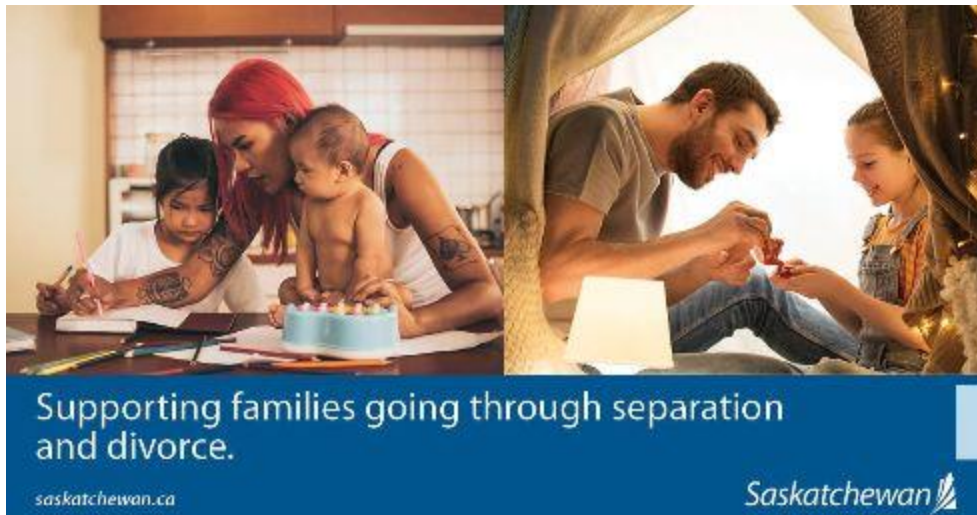
SASKATCHEWAN CROP REPORT



There was rain through all regions of Saskatchewan this past week, with some areas seeing higher amounts of localized precipitation. Growing conditions have been reported to be good in the southeast and east central regions where they have adequate moisture and warm weather. In the western regions, rain was received which was needed to keep crop development progressing and support pasture growth. Producers who did not receive rain are reporting their crops are starting to go backward in development. Livestock producers in the southern and western regions are happy with the rain since haying is coming up soon and the rain will greatly improve their hay yields.

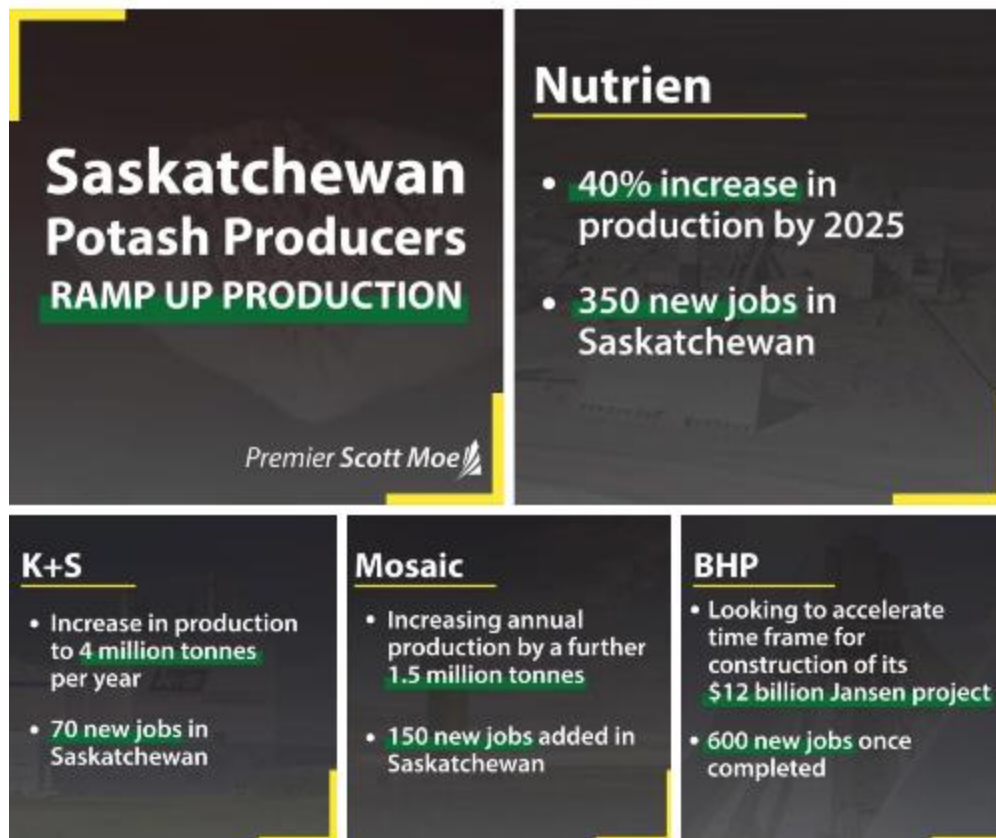

**SHARING A GREAT ARTICLE ON CRAIG REYNOLDS,
PRESIDENT & CEO OF THE SASKATCHEWAN ROUGHRIDERS**

When the CFL was forced to shut down during the pandemic, Craig Reynolds knew it was time to evolve the league.

In the 13 years since Craig Reynolds joined the Saskatchewan Roughriders organization, he's watched the team evolve. First as its CFO and now president and CEO, the 46-year-old Saskatchewan-raised CPA has seen the team emerge from decades of financial turmoil to become one of the most stable franchises in the Canadian Football League.

The league's nine teams were hit hard by the pandemic, which forced the cancellation of the 2020 season. But the Roughriders aren't like most teams.

They are one of three community-owned teams in the CFL (along with the Winnipeg Blue Bombers and Edmonton Elks), meaning that instead of a traditional ownership group at the helm, the club's shareholders are its fans, who can purchase shares and get a say in electing the club's Board of Directors. The arrangement, which is rare in professional sports (the NFL's Green Bay Packers are the only similar example in North America outside of the CFL), is one of the main reasons why the bond between fan and team is as strong as any you'll find in the sporting world. But, without a wealthy owner with deep pockets at the helm, able to sustain operations during a lean period, the community-based

ownership model also created uncertainty during the pandemic when the team was unable to earn revenue.

Heat Stroke
high body temp, absence of sweating, headache, red/flushed dry skin, rapid pulse, difficulty breathing, strange behaviour, hallucinations, confusion, agitation, disorientation, and/or seizure
Call 911

Heat Exhaustion
nausea, vomiting, fatigue, pale skin, weakness, headache, muscle cramps, aches, and dizziness
Get out of heat immediately, drink fluids (avoid caffeine or alcohol) and apply cooling measures (ice or fans)

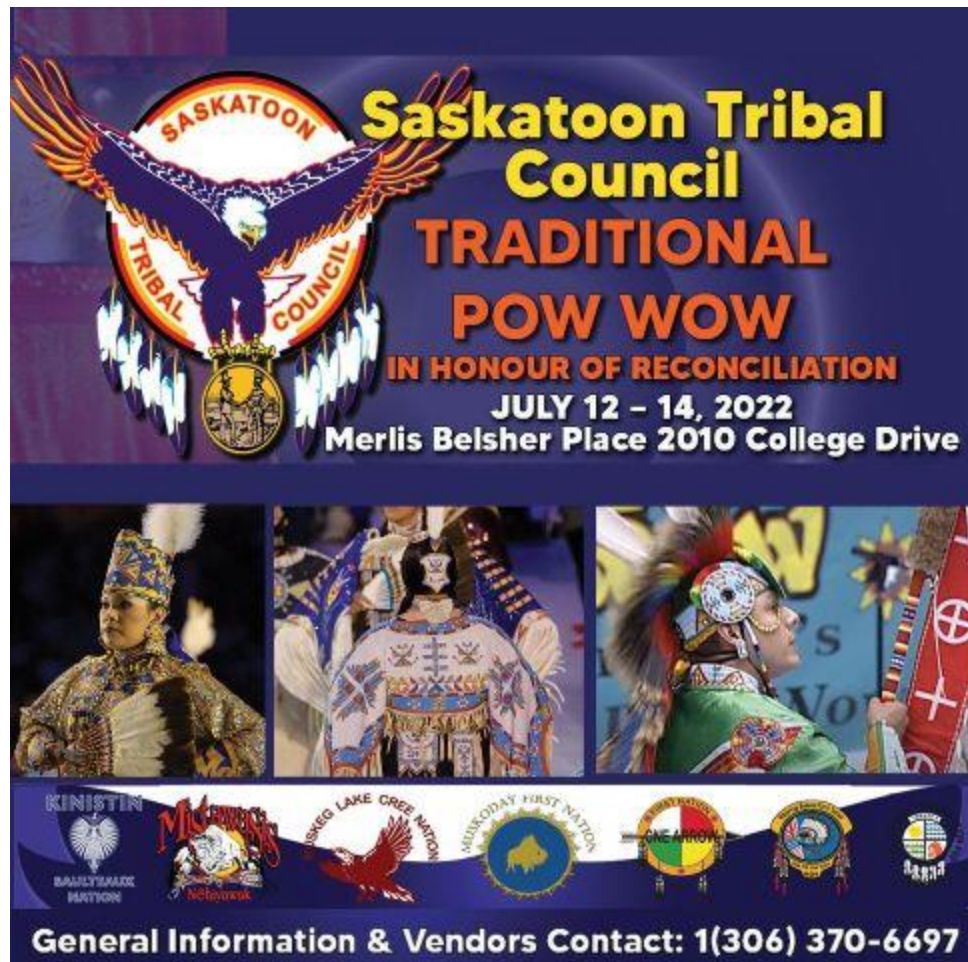
