

**SASKATCHEWAN MOVING TOWARDS SWIFTER, MORE EFFECTIVE PENALTIES FOR IMPAIRED DRIVING**



**The Government of Saskatchewan is moving towards the use of administrative penalties for impaired driving as part of its ongoing commitment to strengthen road safety across the province. This approach would give law enforcement additional tools to hold impaired drivers accountable and remove them from Saskatchewan roads quicker.**

***"Our government continues to strengthen Saskatchewan's response to impaired driving by making consequences more immediate, certain and effective," Justice Minister and Attorney General Tim McLeod, K.C. said. "The changes we are moving towards would give police an additional tool to act quickly at the roadside, while preserving their discretion to proceed with Criminal Code charges in serious cases or whenever criminal prosecution is***

***warranted. This approach supports public safety, helps reduce unnecessary pressure on the justice system and allows police, prosecutors and courts to focus resources where they are needed most."***

**The proposed changes will help strengthen road safety by making it easier to remove impaired drivers from Saskatchewan's roads while supporting police in their efforts to keep our communities safe.**

**Thank you to the Saskatoon Police Service for hosting today's announcement, and to MADD Canada, MADD Saskatoon, law enforcement, and the families who continue to advocate for safer roads across Saskatchewan.**

## **YOUR LEGISLATIVE REPORT RECAP**



**Recent economic indicators continue to show Saskatchewan's strength and resilience. New figures from Statistics Canada show manufacturing sales increased by 18.8 per cent in April 2026 compared to the same month last year, while wholesale trade rose by 17.9 per cent. Saskatchewan ranked first among the provinces for year-over-year growth in wholesale trade and third**

for manufacturing sales.

The housing sector is also seeing strong growth. Data from the Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation shows urban housing starts increased by 50.4 per cent from May 2025 to May 2026, placing Saskatchewan second among the provinces. Growth was seen in both single-family and multi-unit housing construction, reflecting continued confidence in Saskatchewan's economy and communities.

Supporting this momentum is Saskatchewan's continued success in international trade. Our government and the Saskatchewan Trade and Export Partnership recently released the annual State of Trade report, highlighting the province's export performance in 2025. Despite ongoing global economic uncertainty, Saskatchewan exported more than \$43.7 billion worth of goods to over 160 countries around the world. The report also notes that Saskatchewan continues to rank among the highest provinces for exports on a per-capita basis.

Our province remains a trusted supplier of the food, fuel, fertilizer and resources the world depends on. As Saskatchewan continues to diversify export markets and strengthen trade relationships, these opportunities help support jobs, investment and economic growth across the province.

This season also marks an important milestone for thousands of Saskatchewan students. More than 10,000 graduates are completing their studies at universities, colleges technical institutes and other post-secondary institutions across the province. These graduates are entering a workforce that offers a wide range of opportunities in communities throughout Saskatchewan.

Programs such as *the Graduate Retention Program (GRP)* encourage graduates to build their careers here at home by offering up to \$24,000 in tax credits to those who live and work in Saskatchewan after completing their studies. **STUDENT AID APPLICATIONS OPEN FOR SASKATCHEWAN'S POST  
SECONDARY STUDENTS**



**Students pursuing post-secondary education can now access Saskatchewan Student Aid applications for the 2026-27 academic year. Over 24,000 students are expected to benefit from more than \$119.3 million in student loans, grants, scholarships, tax credits and other forms of government student aid this year.**

***"Student aid is a critical resource for many young people pursuing post-secondary education," Advanced Education Minister Ken Cheveldayoff said. "Through the Saskatchewan Student Aid program, students can finance their education and invest in their future here in our province."***

**Students can complete an online Saskatchewan Student Aid application and be assessed for provincial and federal aid programs, including grants and**

loans. Saskatchewan Grade 12 graduates will automatically be considered for the Saskatchewan Advantage Scholarship, which provides up to \$3,000, when they apply for Saskatchewan Student Aid.

## PROTECTING JOBS AND INCREASING WORKERS' WAGES



**On October 1, 2026, minimum wage in Saskatchewan will increase to \$15.70 per hour.**

Saskatchewan's minimum wage is calculated using an indexation formula, which gives equal weight to changes to the Consumer Price Index and Average Hourly Wage for Saskatchewan.

*"To keep Saskatchewan's economy strong, we have tried to balance the need for an increase to the minimum wage with ensuring employers are able to continue to build strong businesses and opportunity for growth," Labour Relations and Workplace Safety Minister Ken Cheveldayoff said. "Our low personal tax rates also continue to make our province a great place to live, work and raise a family."*

 **Did you know?** Canada became a country on **July 1, 1867**, when the provinces of Ontario, Quebec, Nova Scotia, and New Brunswick joined together in Confederation.


 **Did you know?** Canada has the **longest coastline in the world**—stretching more than **243,000 kilometres** along three oceans.


 **Did you know?** Canada is famous for hockey, but **lacrosse is also one of Canada's official national sports**. Hockey is the official national winter sport, while lacrosse is the official national summer sport.


 **Did you know?** The **beaver** became Canada's official national animal in **1975**, recognizing its important role in the country's history and the fur trade.

 **Did you know?** Canada is home to about **9% of the world's forests**, making it one of the most forested countries on Earth.

 **Did you know?** The maple leaf has been a Canadian symbol for over **300 years** and has appeared on the national flag since **1965**.
