

CREE DEVELOPMENTS MARK THE NEXTY STEP TOWARD A

NEW SASKATOON URGENT CARE CENTRE



A new Urgent Care Centre (UCC) is one step closer in Saskatoon, with the signing of an interim project development agreement between the Government of Saskatchewan and Ahtahkakoop Cree Developments (ACD).

"The Saskatoon Urgent Care Centre is a vital part of our government's commitment to delivering health care services that meet the needs of the community," Premier Scott Moe said. "This unique partnership with Ahtahkakoop Cree Developments is enabling us to do that in a way that also looks to ensure future economic benefits for First Nations."

When complete, the UCC will provide enhanced access to quality patient care for Saskatoon residents with an illness or injury that requires urgent attention. The UCC will be available 24 hours a day, seven days a week and will be located at the former Pleasant Hill School site at 215 Avenue S South. The close proximity to St. Paul's Hospital will help to mitigate some of the capacity pressures in the emergency department at St. Paul's Hospital.

UNSAFE VEHICLES REMOVED FROM HIGHWAYS DURING THREE DAY CAMPAIGN




The Saskatchewan Highway Patrol in partnership with SGI removed 103 unsafe commercial vehicles from Saskatchewan highways during a Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance (CVSA) International RoadCheck campaign.

There were 332 inspections performed at the Langham scale with 31% of vehicles and 4.8% of drivers placed out of service. There were 148 trucks/power unit and 82 trailers that passed inspection and received CVSA decals, which are applied if no critical violations are detected during eligible inspections. The other 81 vehicles had mechanical defects that were allowed to continue with the expectation that the defects are corrected before the vehicle takes on its next load.

International RoadCheck is the largest targeted enforcement program on commercial motor vehicles in the world, with nearly 15 trucks and motorcoaches inspected, on average, every minute across North America during a 72-hour period.

CROP REPORT FOR THE PERIOD OF MAY 21 TO MAY 27, 2024



Producers made significant progress this week, with seeding now 77 per cent complete in Saskatchewan. This is behind the five-year average of 91 per cent and the ten-year average of 89 per cent. Crop emergence is reported as excellent to good condition and topsoil moisture shows improvement over past year.

The southeast is the furthest advanced in seeding progress at 84 per cent complete. This is followed closely by the southwest at 83 per cent and the northwest at 80 per cent. The east-central and west-central regions are 73 per cent and 71 per cent, respectively. The northeast region has completed 68 per cent of their seeding operations.

An eight-foot bronze statue depicting a World War II Canadian Soldier, commemorating the Royal Regina Rifles and their contributions on D-Day, has arrived in France for the 80th anniversary of the Juno Beach landings. The statue will be unveiled next week in Normandy.

Minister of Parks, Culture and Sport Laura Ross will be travelling to France to represent the Province of Saskatchewan and participate in the unveiling of the Royal Regina Rifles Statue and the 80th Anniversary of D-Day.

"This statue has travelled thousands of kilometres to be unveiled as part of the 80th anniversary of D-Day celebrations," Ross said. "The Royal Regina Rifles have a proud history, and our government is honoured to have supported them in commemorating the 80th anniversary of D-Day and the Regiment's sacrifices during the Second World War."

JUNE PROCLAIMED AS PARKS AND RECREATION MONTH IN SASKATCHEWAN








