## *Investing \$1.5M* in Teacher Innovation & Support Projects

In 2026-27, **33 new teacher-led projects** will enhance learning opportunities across the province.

**The Government of Saskatchewan is investing nearly \$1.5 million to support 33 new teacher-led projects through the Teacher Innovation and Support Fund (TISF), which will provide enhanced learning opportunities for students across the province in the 2026-27 school year.**



**Launched in 2024, the TISF provides opportunities for Saskatchewan educators to lead innovative initiatives in their schools or divisions, with funding of up to \$75,000 per project.**

**"These projects highlight the creativity and leadership teachers bring to their schools and classrooms every day," Education Minister Everett Hindley said.**

**"Through the Teacher Innovation and Support Fund we are supporting Saskatchewan teachers and students with projects that respond to local needs and help prepare students for future opportunities."**

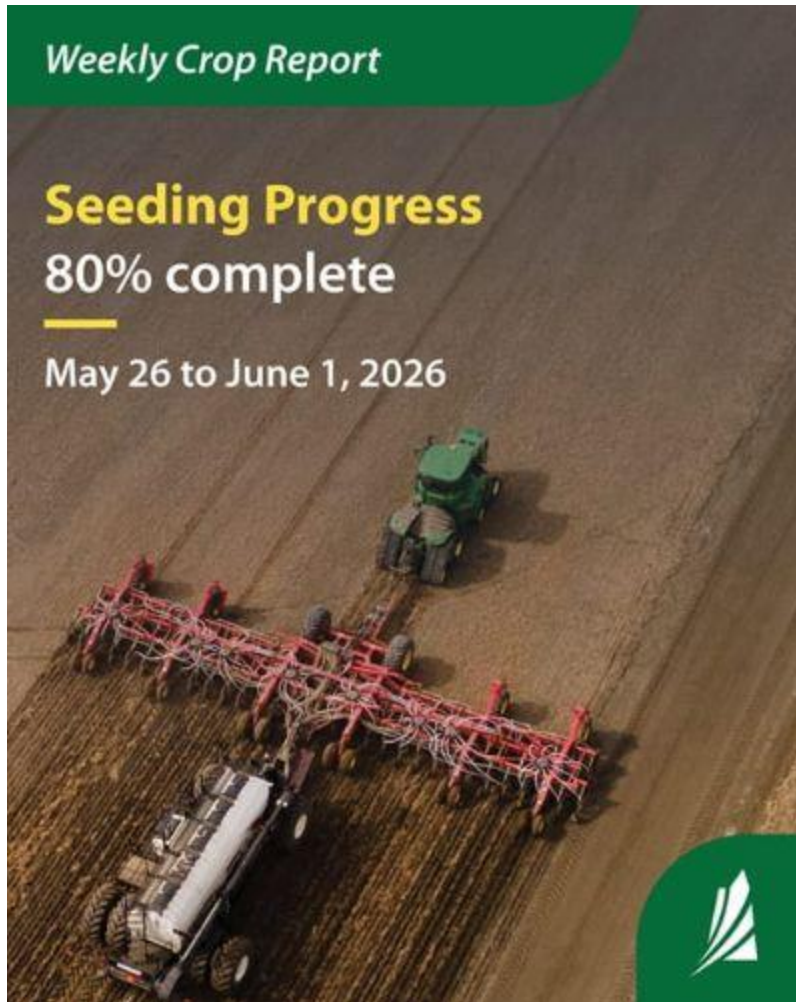

## Seeding Progress 80% complete

May 26 to June 1, 2026



Seeding progress in the province advanced significantly this week, reaching 80 per cent complete, up from 52 per cent last week. While this progress is encouraging, it remains behind the five-year average of 91 per cent and the 10-year average of 92 per cent.

The southwest region leads seeding progress at 91 per cent complete, followed closely by the west-central region at 90 per cent, the southeast region at 87 per cent and the northwest region at 86 per cent. While the northeast and east-central regions made significant seeding progress, they remain behind at 67 per cent and 63 per cent complete, respectively.

**SASKATCHEWAN SUPPORTS CRITICAL ENERGY AND MINERAL RESEARCH  
WITH NEW FUNDING**

## **PROVINCE CRACKS DOWN ON DRUG TRAFFICKERS TO PROTECT SASKATCHEWAN COMMUNITIES**



***The Response to Illicit Drugs Act* comes into force today, June 1, in Saskatchewan.**

**The Act strengthens the province's ability to respond to the harms caused by illicit drug production and trafficking. It establishes new legal tools that allow government and individuals harmed by illicit drug activity to recover costs from those involved in the production, trafficking, importing or exporting of highly addictive drugs.**

***"Drug traffickers cause real and lasting harm to individuals, families and communities across Saskatchewan," Justice Minister and Attorney General***

***Tim McLeod, K.C. said. "By bringing this Act into force, the Government of Saskatchewan is ensuring that those who profit from trafficking deadly substances face meaningful consequences for the damage they cause. At the same time, our government continues to address mental health and addictions through expanded treatment and recovery supports."***

## SASKATCHEWAN CELEBRATES MINING WEEK 2026



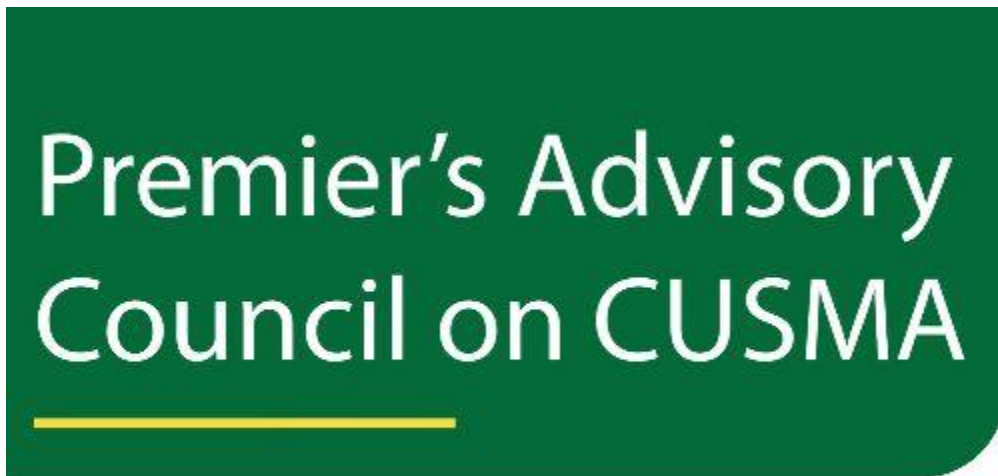

***Council will advise and inform the Premier on the CUSMA review and related U.S. tariff issues.***

**Today, Premier Scott Moe held the inaugural session of the Premier's Advisory Council on CUSMA, an industry-facing council made up of business leaders from economic sectors across the province.**

**A CUSMA joint review will begin on July 1, 2026. Discussions will be led by the federal government, and Saskatchewan will share its priorities leading up to and throughout the review process.**



***"While CUSMA negotiations take place on a federal level, it is crucial that subnational voices like Saskatchewan's are heard," Moe said. "With the U.S. being our largest trading partner, CUSMA and free and fair trade is essential for the economic health and prosperity of the province. This council will help advise and inform our government as formal discussions between Canada, the United States and Mexico begin. As a significant trading partner with the U.S., it will be essential that Saskatchewan priorities are communicated with the federal government."***
