

REPORT FROM THE LEGISLATURE



On March 20, Finance Minister Donna Harpauer will present the 2024-25 Provincial Budget, outlining the strategic investments we are making to continue to drive Saskatchewan's growth. Investments in priority areas like health care, education and communities are only possible due to the strength and growth of our provincial economy.



Our government recently released a new investment attraction strategy, the province's roadmap to increasing investment and further advancing Saskatchewan's Growth Plan goal of \$16 billion in private capital investment annually. Private capital investment in Saskatchewan increased by nearly 25 per cent in 2023 and is expected to lead the nation in 2024.

This plan builds on the significant investment made in our province over the last number of years and introduces new, expanded and improved incentives for industries looking to make Saskatchewan their home. To learn more about the new strategy, visit the new InvestSK website at www.investSK.ca.

The third annual Indigenous Business Gathering at Prairieland Park in Saskatoon was a huge success and builds on our government's commitment to growing, strengthening and diversifying our provincial economy. This year's gathering featured over 85 trade show booths and more than 700 visitors. Our government is committed to economic reconciliation and recognizes that Indigenous businesses play a vital role in Saskatchewan by building inclusion among communities, providing jobs and growth, and helping enrich our quality of life.

Economic growth creates jobs and opportunities here at home, and Saskatchewan recently

received some incredible numbers demonstrating this growth. The province added 18,700 new full-time jobs, which is an increase of 15,200 jobs last month when compared to February 2023, raising Saskatchewan's employment growth rate to 2.6 per cent.

Saskatchewan's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate also remains well below the national average, sitting at 5.0 per cent compared to the national average of 5.8 per cent, the third-lowest amongst the provinces.

Strengthening our economy means investing in the growth of our key industries, like agriculture. Our government will invest \$15 million over five years into the Global Institute for Food Security (GIFS) at the University of Saskatchewan. Funding will support work at the GIFS, which helps keep Saskatchewan producers competitive and helps them remain among the most productive, innovative and sustainable in the world.

The strength and growth across our provincial economy allows our government to continue to invest in priority areas like health care. Our province's ambitious Health Human Resources Action Plan continues to make significant progress in recruiting, training, incentivizing and retaining health care workers.

To date, nearly 300 hard-to-recruit positions have been filled through the Rural and Remote Recruitment Incentive, and more than 1,000 Saskatchewan and out-of-province nursing grads have been hired since 2022. We will continue to make significant investments to build a stronger, more resilient health care system for the people of Saskatchewan.

As our government continues work to increase health human resources, we are exploring ways to expand the use of Nurse Practitioners across the health care system. The Ministry of Health is working to pilot a new model for independently-operated, publicly-funded Nurse Practitioner clinics. These new clinics will help to improve access to health care services for Saskatchewan patients and their families.

Fourteen new doctors are now practicing in rural Saskatchewan after completing the Saskatchewan International Physician Practice Assessment (SIPPA) program in December. The number of SIPPA training seats was recently expanded from 36 to 45 per year, and plans are underway to add more seats to the program. SIPPA plays an important role in our province's ongoing recruitment efforts and we welcome the latest group of graduates and their families to communities throughout the province.

Education is a huge priority for our government as well. A new agreement with the Saskatchewan School Boards Association ensures a minimum of \$356.6 million per year for four years for classroom supports. Now that our government has made this commitment in writing, it is time for

the Saskatchewan Teachers Federation to end their job action and return to the bargaining table so that students and teachers can return to the classroom.

Our government continues to invest in new programs that create solutions to challenges in the classroom. Fifteen new teacher-led projects have received funding through the Teacher Innovation and Support Fund. This brings the total allocated in this fund to over \$800,000 in two months and reinforces our government's commitment to providing additional classroom supports to our students and teachers.

Third Lowest Unemployment Rate Among the Provinces

Statistics Canada released labour force statistics for the month of February, which showcase the growth of Saskatchewan's strong workforce. The province added 18,700 new full-time jobs, which is an increase of 15,200 jobs last month when compared to February 2023, raising Saskatchewan's employment growth rate to 2.6 per cent.

Saskatchewan's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate also continues to be well below the national average, sitting at 5.0 per cent compared to the national average of 5.8 per cent, the third-lowest amongst the provinces.

"Saskatchewan continues to build a strong labour force, with further growth in job numbers," Immigration and Career Training Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "These latest numbers highlight how our commitment to growing the workforce is getting results. Through the Labour Market Strategy released earlier this week, our government will continue investing in programs and services to enhance recruitment, training and retention efforts in the province, ensuring we have the labour force we need to support our economy."

GOVERNMENT OF SASKATCHEWAN AND SASKATCHEWAN SCHOOL BOARDS ASSOCIATION ANNOUNCE MULTI-YEAR FUNDING AGREEMENT



Government is committed to working with Saskatchewan's locally elected school boards to ensure that there is long-term and sustainable funding to support our classrooms.

To demonstrate this, government is pleased to announce that it has signed a multi-year funding agreement with the Saskatchewan School Boards Association (SSBA), with the support of Saskatchewan's locally elected boards of education. The agreement guarantees a base amount of long-term funding to school divisions and signifies a shared commitment to enhancing educational outcomes and providing additional classroom supports across the province.

It provides a minimum of \$356.6 million per year for four years for classroom supports as well as increased investment into youth mental health resources as part of a budget that marks the largest increase of \$180 million to school operating funding ever.

"This agreement provides a written guarantee, signed by the government, for long-term funding for classroom supports - funding that will address important issues like classroom size and complexity," Education Minister Jeremy Cockrill said. "Now that our government has made this unprecedented commitment in a signed agreement, it's time for the Saskatchewan Teachers Federation to end their job action and return to the bargaining table, so that students and teachers can return to the classroom."

"This agreement represents the willingness of both the Ministry of Education and school boards to work collaboratively toward solutions with some predictable and sustainable funding to back it up," SSBA President Jaimie Smith-Windsor said. "These issues are best addressed at the local level, working with teachers, staff, students, parents, and families."

This partnership formalizes a commitment to ongoing collaboration between government and school boards in supporting students across the province and establishes a new pathway to long-term funding sustainability. This agreement underscores a mutual recognition of the importance of local decision-making, the diversity of Saskatchewan's communities, and signals strengthening relationships by providing direct investment for Saskatchewan classrooms.

GOVERNMENT OF SASKATCHEWAN COMMITS \$15 MILLION TO GLOBAL INSTITUTE FOR FOOD SECURITY AT THE UNIVERSITY OF SASKATCHEWAN



Agriculture Minister David Marit announced a funding commitment today of \$15 million over five years to the Global Institute for Food Security (GIFS) at the University of Saskatchewan.

Founded in 2012 as part of the University of Saskatchewan's world-class agri-science hub, GIFS works with its partners to provide expertise and leadership in the discovery, development and delivery of innovative solutions to produce globally sustainable food.

"This kind of substantial commitment is fundamental to keeping our agriculture industry a global leader in technology, production and best practices, and the track record GIFS has established proves it," Marit said. "Investing in research activities undertaken by GIFS and similar institutions is the first step toward enabling Saskatchewan's producers to not only stay competitive, but proving that they remain among the most productive, innovative and sustainable in the world."

NEW RECORD FOR MUNICIPAL REVENUE SHARING AT \$340.2 MILLION

Premier Scott Moe has announced that Saskatchewan's 2024-25 Municipal Revenue Sharing (MRS) Program will set a new record at \$340.2 million, an increase of approximately \$42.3 million more than the previous year.



This increase is a 14 per cent increase from the 2023-24 fiscal year, and a 167 per cent increase from 2007-08.

"Our government made the commitment to Saskatchewan communities to create and support a predictable revenue-sharing tool that grows with our province's economy," Moe said. "With this announcement, more than \$4.3 billion in provincial funding has been allocated since 2007 to support the priorities of municipalities."

MINISTER VANDAL ANNOUNCES INVESTMENT IN PROCESSING OF RARE EARTH ELEMENTS IN SASKATCHEWAN



Saskatchewan is a mining powerhouse, providing potash for agriculture, uranium for clean fuel, helium for medical and industrial use, and now rare earth elements (REE), which are used in electric vehicles (EVs), wind turbines, everyday electronics, and industrial uses.

Thanks to leaders like the Saskatchewan Research Council (SRC), the province is going beyond mining and exploration, to processing and commercializing value-added products using REEs at the Rare Earth Processing Facility in Saskatoon; the first of its kind in Canada.

"With this investment from PrairiesCan, along with the initial \$71 million investment from the Government of Saskatchewan, SRC continues to break new ground in the rare earth space, helping establish a rare earth hub in Saskatchewan," Minister responsible for Saskatchewan Research Council Jeremy Harrison said. "These latest innovations will ensure Saskatchewan is producing the highest quality REE metals to power global technology."

GOVERNMENT OF SASKATCHEWAN INTRODUCES NEW BEAR SPRAY REGULATIONS



Bear spray is an important tool that helps protect individuals from aggressive wildlife encounters while living, working and exploring wilderness areas, but it has no place in our malls, city parks, and sporting events.

The Wildlife Control (Capsaicin) Products Regulations enacted today make it illegal to possess or carry bear spray in urban public spaces in Saskatchewan. It is also now illegal to deface and alter bear spray cans to conceal them from law enforcement.

Individuals caught breaking these regulations can be charged and face fines of up to \$100,000.

Use bear spray for its intended purpose. Keep it out of urban public places.



Scammers can build an entire legitimate-looking website within a couple of hours, so it can be difficult to spot fake cryptocurrency platforms.


When considering investing in cryptocurrency, you should verify the following information first:.

- 1. Are they registered with the Canadian Securities Administrators? Remember, they must be registered within Saskatchewan, which you can check at the following link: https://bit.ly/42xJoCQ
- 3. Do not download any software programs as this may give the scammer remote access to your device where they can gain access to your accounts and personal information.

STUDY NUCLEAR MEDICINE TECHNOLOGY AT SAIT




Kickstart your health care career in Saskatchewan and train to become a Nuclear Medicine Technologist!
