RECAP - LEGISLATIVE REPORT



Agriculture Literacy Month and Rendez-vous de la Francophonie. Both pillars of our culture and heritage, we value educating our future generations on their roots and taking the time to celebrate these occasions. Thank you to the many volunteers in our province who bring these events to life for the young and the young at heart.

Adult education is also a cornerstone of our province's success with 51 excellent post-secondary colleges and universities. Post-secondary graduates building their careers in Saskatchewan can now benefit from up to \$24,000 in tax credits from the Graduate Retention Program (GRP). Saskatchewan has increased the lifetime GRP maximum by 20 per cent for students who graduate on or after October 1, 2024.

The GRP offers tuition rebates to graduates who live and file taxes in Saskatchewan after they complete their post-secondary program. Graduates receive the tax credits

over a seven-year period and have up to 10 years after graduation to claim GRP or apply any unused credits.

This month is also the 60th anniversary of the Status of Women Office. Since its establishment in 1964, the Status of Women Office improved equality and offered protections for women in the workplace, increased maternity leave to extend time with newborn children. IT also enhanced supports and resources for women experiencing interpersonal violence along with innovative measures focused on preventing violence and abuse from occurring.

The Government of Saskatchewan and Saskatchewan Association of Rural Municipalities recently announced more than \$34.4 million for 32 road, bridge and culvert projects. This supports the export of goods and resources originating in rural municipalities. Through the Rural Integrated Roads for Growth program, the Ministry of Highways will invest more than \$12.6 million toward the projects and rural municipalities will fund the remaining more than \$21.7 million. The work will occur in the 2025 construction season.

In addition to the promise kept for significant road projects, the government of Saskatchewan has also kept it's promise for increased ease of living for seniors. The \$43 million in targeted initiatives to support seniors to live within their communitie sinclude: providing home nursing services free of charge, subsidize supportive services through home care, subsidize the overall cost of publicly funded long-term care, provide reduced ambulance costs and cap the cost of prescription drugs to \$25, for those listed on the Saskatchewan Formulary and those approved under Exception Drug Status, extending coverage of Continuous and Flash Glucose Monitoring Systems and more.

A second Ronald McDonald House Charities home was announced for Saskatchewan in the past four weeks. The Government of Saskatchewan announced \$3.5 million in funding to build one for the first time ever in Prince Albert. This will bring a third Ronald McDonald House to our province. There has been a long-standing home in Saskatoon, the second currently under construction in Regina and soon to break ground will the one for the north in Prince Albert.

Our government's commitment to children's nutrition in and outside of the classroom was expanded this week. A three-year joint-agreement under the National School Food Program was signed. Nutrition at school contributes to positive student outcomes including: improved academic work, initiative, class participation and problem solving.

As President Trump in the United States continues to change his thoughts of US relations with partnering countries, Premier Scott Moe, your cabinet and MLAs are working daily with their counterparts in the US and around the world. Recently, Premier Moe and Energy and Resources Minister Colleen Young lead a mission to

CERAWeek 2025, the world's premier energy conference. While in Houston, their focus was on emphasizing Saskatchewan's world-class leadership in responsible energy development, sustainability and innovation.

At home this week, our government announced record-setting Municipal Revenue Sharing (MRS) in the upcoming 2025-26 Provincial Budget with \$361.8 million, an increase of \$21.5 million or 6.3 per cent from last year. MRS provides predictable, unconditional funding to Saskatchewan cities, towns, villages and rural municipalities based on three-quarters of one point of provincial sales tax revenue from two years prior. The predictable nature of the funding ensures that communities are able to make budget plans knowing what their annual allocation will be, providing stability for strategic investments at the municipal level.



ABOVE NORMAL RUNOFF EXPECTED FOR MOST OF SOUTHERN SASKATCHEWAN




The Water Security Agency (WSA) released the Spring Runoff Report for 2025.

A normal to above normal runoff is forecast for most of central and southern Saskatchewan due to an above normal snowpack.

Runoff across most of the north and parts of the southeast is expected to be below normal due to dry fall conditions and a below normal snowpack in these areas.

Most major water reservoirs in southern Saskatchewan are at or above normal levels for this time of year and are expected to be near normal levels following the spring runoff.



"Over the winter, we have seen moisture conditions improve in parts of the province with higher than forecasted snowpack particularly across the south-central area of the province," Minister Responsible for the Water Security Agency Daryl Harrison said. "This, combined with overwinter operating plans at reservoirs designed to retain water supplies, means water supply conditions have improved over last year."



GOVERNMENT OF SASKATCHEWAN ACTIVATES PROVINCIAL RESPONSE TO TOXIC DRUG CRISIS

EMERGENCY RESPONSE

The Government of Saskatchewan announced that the Provincial Emergency Operations Centre (PEOC) is being activated to enhance the response to the toxic drug crisis in Saskatoon.

The Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency (SPSA) will coordinate the activation in collaboration with the City of Saskatoon and Ministry of Health.

"Activating the PEOC will allow us to enhance the coordination between government ministries and organizations that respond to overdoses," SPSA President Marlo Pritchard said. "This approach will help us reinforce the work being done to save lives across the province. This collaborative effort will allow for enhanced coordination, allow for stronger communication and reduce gaps."

To date the Ministry of Health and the Saskatchewan Health Authority have also provided additional naloxone kits to organizations in Saskatoon.

Spring Melt Tip





- Did You Know Most of the World's French Fries Come from New Brunswick?

New Brunswick-based McCain Foods makes one-third of all the frozen French fries produced in the world, and many come from a \$65-million state-of-the art potato processing plant that's in Florenceville-Bristol. The small town in western New Brunswick has taken on the moniker 'The French Fry Capital of the World.' Not surprisingly, this is the location of the Potato World museum, and the heart of the mid-July National French Fry Day celebrations.



- Did You Know Carleton Place Makes the World's Best Baseball Bats?

In 2012, more than 100 Major League Baseball players chose to swing Canadian maple wood bats - better known as the "Sam Bat". Sam Holman, founder of the The Original Maple Bat Corporation, invented the bat by choosing maple wood, a harder wood than the traditionally used ash. So, if you see a professional player with a little logo on their baseball bat, that's one of the 18,000 sluggers produced each year in Carleton Place, a half-hour from Ottawa.



- Did You Know Saskatchewan Produces Most of the World's Lentils?

Mmmm, Lentils! Whether home or travelling abroad, order some lentil soup and odds are you're getting a little taste of home. Canada is the largest exporter of green lentils in the world - about 1.5 million metric tonnes annually, with 95% of it coming from Saskatchewan.



- Did You Know Scarborough Makes Most of the World's Halls?

If you pick up a pack of Halls you'll be getting another little taste of home since they are made in Scarborough, Ontario. The plant at Bertrand produced more than 6 billion pieces of "medicine" for the U.S. Last year – enough that if you lined them side-by-side they would circle the earth at the equator approximately 3.4 times.



- Did You Know Winnipeg Mints Coins for Over 60 Countries?

Canada produces currency for more countries than you can imagine! The Royal Winnipeg Mint produces coins for 60 different countries, including Centavos for Cuba, kroner for Norway, and pesos for Colombia.. Currently the mint can produce over 20 million coins a day.



- Did You Know Hamilton Makes the World's Swedish Fish?

Those chewy Swedish Fish sure weren't made in Sweden! More than 5 billion of the colourful little candies are produced in Hamilton, Ontario every year – that's all of the Swedish Fish consumed in North America. Every day about 13 million of the little fish are produced at a factory in Hamilton, which also makes all Maynards Candy for Canada, and key brands for the U.S, including Sour Patch Kids.



- Did You Know Toronto Makes the World's Best Racing Bikes?

Using the same tools and techniques as Formula One teams, Toronto-based Cervélo builds what have been called the world's fastest and lightest bikes. At the 2008 Olympics in Beijing, athletes riding Cervélo bikes won 10 medals, while in 2008 Carl OS Sastre rode a Cervélo bike to win Le Tour de France.



- Did You Know the World's Best Cymbals come from New Brunswick

Where do the cymbals used by Rush, Keith Harris of the Black Eyed Peas, the Philadelphia Orchestra and marching bands around the world come from? The small village of Meductic (population 300), located along the Saint John River in southern New Brunswick . SABIAN cymbals are sold in 120 countries around the world.



- Did You Know Kelowna Makes Most of the World's Water Slides?

When you slip down one of those clear tube water slides on a Disney Cruise, you're likely using Canadian design and technology. Canada's Whitewater West Industries Ltd. Is the largest water parks attraction company in the world. Their Kelowna, B.C. Facility, FormaShape, makes thousands of water slides each year.



- Did you know that CCM makes "Tack's" the World best Hockey Skates designed by George Tackaberry who sold out the company in 1937. All based in Winnipeg, Manitoba. Also known as the third cousin of Keith Gilmour and the family connection for 600 years.


