

ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL SEASON AT THE QUINN STEVENSON MEMORIAL RINK




With spring finally here, skating at the QSMR is now officially done for the season. This years season was 108 days long from November 30 to today.



PROVINCE RELEASE STRATEGIC PLAN TO ADVANCE SMALL MODULAR REACTORS



The governments of Ontario, Saskatchewan, New Brunswick and Alberta have agreed to a joint strategic plan outlining the path forward on small modular reactors (SMRs).

A Strategic Plan for the Deployment of Small Modular Reactors highlights how SMRs can provide safe, reliable and zero-emissions energy to power our growing economy and population, while creating new opportunities to export Canadian knowledge and expertise around the world.

"SaskPower has worked closely with Ontario Power Generation, New Brunswick Power and Bruce Power to advance the pan-Canadian deployment of SMR technologies to the benefit of all regions of the country," Minister Responsible for SaskPower Don Morgan said. "In particular, SaskPower's four-year collaboration with OPG to assess SMR designs for fleet-based deployment in both Ontario and Saskatchewan has laid a strong foundation for nuclear power and to support deep reductions in Canada's GHG emissions to ultimately achieve net zero by 2050."
