

The Third Session of the Twenty-Ninth Legislature resumed Monday, March 6

REPORT FROM THE LEGISLATURE



Saskatchewan's provincial motto is "from many peoples' strength." Our province's strength comes from strong families, communities, businesses and industries. Our government is committed to investing in programs and services that support and build on this strength. Last fall's Speech from the Throne provided the groundwork for several of these initiatives. Now, with our government back in Regina for the spring sitting of the Legislative Assembly, we are ready to continue moving forward with investments that will continue to build upon our province's strengths.

We are investing in regulated child care to strengthen families across the province. In a partnership with the federal government, our government announced this week that parent fees for regulated child care will be reduced to \$10 per day starting April 1. Saskatchewan is one of the first provinces to achieve this milestone, three years ahead of schedule.

Investing in affordable, inclusive and high-quality childcare ensures Saskatchewan children get a strong start in life. In addition, improving child care strengthens families by giving parents the flexibility to build both a family and a career. This investment builds on the Growth Plan commitment to improving childcare and education to meet the needs of our growing province.

Our government is moving forward on the development of provincially regulated online learning programs. Course options are now available at the new Saskatchewan Distance Learning Corporation

(Sask DLC) website. Over 180 courses will be offered for Kindergarten through Grade 12 students, including more than 120 high school courses. Sask DLC students will be able to access support virtually or at one of ten regional campuses across the province.

The Sask DLC program will strengthen Saskatchewan's education system by allowing students greater flexibility and new learning opportunities. The development of the program further builds on the Growth Plan commitment to improve childcare and education.

We are also continuing to invest in connectivity for rural communities across Saskatchewan. SaskTel announced the sixth phase of its Rural Fibre Initiative, during which it will be adding infiNET service to 48 communities across the province. The Rural Fibre Initiative is a multi-phase program that will see SaskTel invest \$200 million to bring infiNET services to residents and businesses in over 130 rural communities.

This investment is part of our Growth Plan commitment to expand SaskTel's fibre optic network and have one million broadband access points by 2025. SaskTel's infiNET services strengthen rural Saskatchewan's families and businesses by helping them stay connected and access online resources.

Our government has invested in the Crop Insurance Program to help agricultural producers mitigate risk on their farms. Crop Insurance coverage will reach a record-high \$446 per acre on average for 2023. Other highlights for this year's program include new individual premiums, increased coverage for unseeded acres and increased AgriStability compensation. Crop Insurance helps strengthen our agriculture industry by supporting Saskatchewan producers. It also helps build on the Growth Plan commitment of building a sustainable and resilient agriculture industry.

By investing in programs and services that support the strength of families, communities, businesses and industries, our government is investing in a strong Saskatchewan. A strong Saskatchewan will have opportunities and prosperity, now and into the future. That's growth that works for everyone.

SASKATCHEWAN TO ACHIEVE \$10 A DAY CHILD CARE BY

APRIL 2023



The Governments of Saskatchewan and Canada are pleased to announce that parent fees for regulated child care in the province will be reduced to \$10 a day starting April 1, 2023.

Saskatchewan is one of the first Canadian provinces to achieve this milestone, which is three years ahead of schedule as outlined in the <u>Canada-Saskatchewan Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care Agreement</u> to bring down child care fees to \$10 day by 2025-26.

"The Government of Saskatchewan is committed to investing in affordable, inclusive and high-quality child care that provides children with a positive start in life while also giving parents the flexibility and choice to build both a family and career," Education Minister Dustin Duncan said.



Parents whose children are under the age of six and attend regulated child care on a full-time basis can expect to pay \$217.50 per month. The fee reductions will result in families saving an average of \$395 to \$573 per month for each child under six from the average comparable fees as of March 31, 2021.

Long-Time MLA Lyle Stewart Stepping Down for Health Reasons

Lumsden-Morse MLA Lyle Stewart today announced that he is resigning his seat due to health-related reasons.

"I have been living with prostate cancer for a number of years now, but unfortunately, my condition has worsened in recent weeks to the point that I can no longer do this job to the standard I expect of myself and that my constituents deserve," Stewart said.

"It has been the honour of my life to represent the people of Lumsden-Morse and Thunder Creek as their MLA for the past 23 and a half years. It has also been an honour to work with the two best and most successful leaders in Canada - Premier Brad Wall and Premier Scott Moe.

"I believe that together with Premier Wall, Premier Moe and all of my caucus colleagues, we have made a change in Saskatchewan that is both positive and indelible."

Premier Scott Moe said he will miss working with Stewart and thanked him for his service to his constituents, the government, and the province.

"Lyle was a great Ag minister, always standing up for Saskatchewan producers and initiating many of the great trade relationships we have today," Moe said. "But first and foremost, he has been a dedicated and hard-working MLA, always looking out for the best interests of the people he serves."

Stewart was first elected in 1999 and was re-elected in the five subsequent provincial elections. In 2004, he served briefly as Interim Leader of the Saskatchewan Party and Leader of the Opposition. In government, Stewart served as Minister of Enterprise and Innovation, Minister of Agriculture, Provincial Secretary and Legislative Secretary responsible for Provincial Autonomy.

His resignation is effective this Friday, March 10. A byelection will be held within six months of his resignation.

### **SASKATOON'S EMPLOYMENT GROWTH UP 9.6%**

I had the privilege to rise in the house this week to highlight Saskatoon's employment growth that is up 9.6%! That means Saskatoon has the highest rate of job growth in the nation. It is also the largest increase our city has seen over the last 15 years.

16,700 more people were employed in Saskatoon in 2022 than the year prior. Saskatoon now has over 59,000 more people employed that it did in 2006. The city is also anticipated to lead the nation in GDP

growth, with 7.2% forecasted for 2023.

With more record levels of private investment coming into the province, we expect to see this growth continue across all sectors. As well, Saskatoon had 3,100 more people employed in healthcare in 2022 than in 2021.



# SASKATCHEWAN LEADS THE NATION IN MERCHANDISE EXPORT GROWTH






Together, we recognize and celebrate the achievements of women and girls throughout Saskatchewan.

WINTER WEIGHTS REMOVED LATER THIS MONTH



Truckers are advised to closely monitor their loads when using secondary highways in Saskatchewan.

This is the time of year when truckers must reduce the weight of their loads, since all secondary highways revert back to regulation weights. This prevents damaging important roads in the spring.

"It's imperative we protect our road network at this time of year by reducing the weights trucks are allowed to carry," Highways Minister Jeremy Cockrill said. "On different occasions throughout the year, we adjust allowable weights to ensure the efficient movement of goods while protecting our highway infrastructure."

Winter weights are being removed effective Wednesday, March 15, 2023 at midnight (12:01 a.m.). Any existing winter weights will be removed and revert back to regulation weight.

A few friendly reminders of our rink rules:

- Family/Public Skate times at the rink are Mondays and Wednesdays, 4pm-6pm and Saturdays 10am-12pm.
- Have fun and be respectful.
- No sticks during family/public skating times or learn to skate programs. Respect the rink skating schedule as posted.
- Spend a few minutes scraping the ice.
- Shovel snow OVER the boards. When shoveled snow is left against the boards, it turns ice solid, and the volunteer crew is getting too old to shovel hard now.
- Always leave the place cleaner than you found it. Don't leave garbage and if you see some, please pick it up. There are garbage cans outside and inside the warm-up rink.
- Children and inexperienced skaters should use an approved helmet while on the ice to prevent injuries.
- Do not use the rink during unusually warm weather.
- Stay off the ice surface while it's being resurfaced
