**GREAT ATTENDANCE AT THE DOG'S BREAKFAST!** 



### REPORT FROM THE LEGISLATURE



Saskatchewan is in a position of immense opportunity. Our Growth Plan has goals and actions to attract more jobs, people and investment. We have been fortunate to see major achievements already, with the 2020s shaping up to be Saskatchewan's decade.

As we work to ensure the growth is sustainable for future generations, our government is exploring the future of energy production. We are promoting Saskatchewan-made innovations, supporting investment in our economy and partnering with other provinces to make advancements in clean technology.

With a growing population and economy comes a need for safe, reliable, cost-effective and environmentally friendly energy production. We have been working with the governments of Ontario, Alberta and New Brunswick to evaluate the development and deployment of Small Modular Reactors, or SMRs.

Currently, fossil fuels generate 76 per cent of our electricity here in Saskatchewan. SMRs are one way to help meet customer demand for reliable power while reducing greenhouse gas emissions.

This evaluation process takes time, and we do not expect a final decision on whether to build SMRs in Saskatchewan for several years. Properly engaging with Indigenous rights holders, stakeholders, and the public is a large part of this process.

Extensive planning will ensure the safe, responsible deployment and operation of this new source of emissions-free electricity that our growing province needs. If this new technology meets those criteria, the industry could put Saskatchewan at the forefront of nuclear research and innovation.

One of the major benefits of SMRs is that they can provide a baseload of sustainable, clean electricity to large, small and even remote off-grid communities or industrial sites. They are scalable, meaning they can be designed to support the immediate area or easily expanded to support the provincial electrical supply. A 300 Megawatt SMR can generate enough electricity each year to supply 300,000 homes. SMRs would complement renewable energy sources such as wind, solar or hydro, creating a reliable power network.

Additionally, this technology will utilize more Saskatchewan products. Northern Saskatchewan has large quantities of the best uranium on the planet. The world is already looking to our province for this natural resource. By utilizing SMRs here at home, there is an opportunity to grow the industry further. The proposed SMRs have the potential to create thousands of new jobs in mining, construction, facility operations, nuclear and non-nuclear supply chains, and research and development. Many of these new career opportunities will be in Northern Saskatchewan, creating billions of dollars in economic benefits. Exploring the possibilities of reactor use is nothing new to our province. The Saskatchewan Research Council has been involved in this field for over four decades. The SLOWPOKE-2 research reactor was first commissioned in 1981 and was a tool for neutron analysis. Over that time, the reactor showed that nuclear technology is safe, reliable and sustainable.

Exploring SMRs will build on the research and development gained from operating the SLOWPOKE-2 research reactor. This is an opportunity to create and promote an entire industry from start to finish. We will continue to explore this exciting new field with a keen eye on safety, environmental impact and meeting the needs of our province. This is just one of the many fields in Saskatchewan's expanding and diversifying economy.

Saskatchewan is growing, and our need for reliable utilities is on the rise. Our government is committed to exploring new ideas and innovations that everyone can benefit from. These advancements draw new industries to the province, creating more jobs and strengthening our communities.

### GOVERNMENT EXPANDS INTENSIVE CARE UNIT CAPACITY ACROSS SASKATCHEWAN



A total of 11 Intensive Care Unit (ICU) beds will be added this year to add capacity to Saskatchewan's acute care system.

Six new beds are now in operation at Regina General (2), St. Paul's Saskatoon (3) and Prince Albert Victoria Hospital (1). Five more beds will open later this year at Pasqua Hospital Regina (4) and Yorkton Hospital (1).

### **EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION MONTH**



May is Early Childhood Education month. This year, Saskatchewan is recognizing this month by thanking all early childhood educators for the impactful work they do and by highlighting additional investments into the Early Childhood Intervention Program (ECIP).

ECIP is a free service for families with children aged newborn to six who are experiencing disability or delay. In 2022-23, early childhood intervention programs will receive \$5.2 million, an increase of \$744,000 over last year to help the 14 Saskatchewan ECIPs address increased demand and waitlists for their services. On average, ECIPS serve approximately 1,200 families each year.

"We know that as our population grows, so will demand for ECIP services," Education Minister Dustin Duncan said. "Our government will continue to prioritize early childhood education through increased investments necessary to support our early childhood educators and the families they assist."

# APPLICATION WINDOW OFFICIALLY OPEN FOR THE CREATIVE SASKATCHEWAN FEATURE FILM AND TELEVISION PRODUCTION GRANT



Recent amendments to The Creative Saskatchewan Regulations and the Creative Saskatchewan Feature Film and Television Production Grant Program will greatly enhance the province's ability to attract larger film and television projects.

Creative Saskatchewan's Feature Film and TV Production Program will now have a \$5 million funding threshold for eligible production companies to access in the 2022-23 year. The bonus structure will encourage spending in rural areas, as well co-production and post-production opportunities.

"These changes will ensure that Creative Saskatchewan has the flexibility to attract larger productions with the increased funding provided in this year's budget," Parks, Culture and Sport Minister Laura Ross said. "It allows our investment to thrive and support the province's Growth Plan in many ways. This includes growing our labour force, the technology sector, increasing tourism, and supporting sectors like the hospitality industry. It will also create more opportunities for young people to realize their future right here in Saskatchewan."

#### SASKATCHEWAN OPENS NEW TRADE OFFICE IN INDIA




Minister of Trade and Export Development, Jeremy Harrison, was in India last week and opened Saskatchewan's newest trade office.

# UKRAINE FUNDRAISER GENERATES \$250,000 FOR SASKATOON SISTER CITY!

Applause filled the room Wednesday as students from Bethlehem Catholic High School flipped signs with numbers on stage, revealing that \$250,000 had been raised for Ukraine thanks to a luncheon put on by a Saskatoon committee.

The event was raising money specifically for the city of Chernivtsi, Saskatoon's Ukrainian sister city.

About 400 business owners and community members attended the event, in the name of helping to purchase, donate and ship essential supplies that Saskatoon's Ukrainian sister city needs.

Laurianne Gabruch was part of the committee that organized the afternoon. She says the money is going towards practical needs like bandages, but will also pay for a plane to help get the supplies where they need to be delivered.

Gabruch is a member of the Ukrainian Canadian Congress' Saskatoon branch and a semi-retired teacher working at Bethlehem Catholic High School in the Ukrainian bilingual program. It was her students who helped out at the afternoon event.

"It is good for them to see the support," Gabruch said, noting there have been many hard conversations over messages and in the classroom since war first broke out in Ukraine.

### MINIMUM WAGE WILL INCREASE TO \$13 PERHOUR THIS YEAR, \$15 BY 2024



On October 1, 2022, the provincial minimum wage will increase from \$11.81 to \$13.00 per hour.

"World events continue to put upward pressure on the cost of living in Saskatchewan and across Canada," Labour Relations and Workplace Safety Minister Don Morgan said. "Our government is committed to ensuring life is affordable for our low income residents by increasing the minimum wage over the next three years. This commitment to affordability will support Saskatchewan workers, and ensure Saskatchewan is the best place to live, work, and raise a family."

On October 1, 2023, minimum wage will increase to \$14 per hour and on October 1, 2024, it will increase to \$15 per hour. This will represent a 27 per cent increase to the minimum wage by 2024.

### **CROP REPORT FOR THE PERIOD OF APRIL 26 TO MAY 2, 2022**



Cool temperatures and early spring snowstorms have delayed seeding for many producers across Saskatchewan. Currently, one per cent of the 2022 crop is now in the ground, well behind the five-year average (2017-2021) of five per cent. Once conditions are favourable, producers will be working very hard to get their fields seeded.

Very little precipitation was reported in the past week, which will allow fields to dry up enough for seeding to begin in regions where it was previously too wet. The most rain was reported in the Marengo area with 10 mm followed by the Marquis, Rockglen and Webb areas reporting five mm of rain. Although beneficial

for pastures and hay land, farmers are hoping the rain will hold off until seeding can be completed.

Wanuskewin Heritage Park = The first crocus of the season have been spotted by the Medicine Wheel! Mostos means Bison and Otci means Belly Button. Mostos Otci is the Plains Cree word for the Prairie Crocus.

Elders say that when you come upon a Mostos Otci in the spring it marks the spot where a baby bison was born. Others say the crocus marks the spot where the baby calf has lost its belly button. It was a marker to Indigenous people where the buffalo have migrated through.


