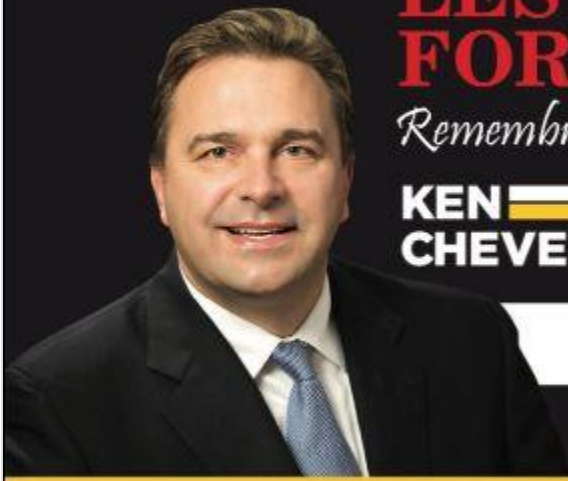

When to wear a Poppy:

The lapel Poppy should be worn during the Remembrance period, from the last

Friday in October until November 11. The Legion encourages the wearing of Poppies at funerals of Veterans, and for any commemorative event such as a memorial service, or the anniversary of the Battle of Vimy Ridge. As well, it is not inappropriate to wear a Poppy during other times to commemorate Fallen Veterans and it is an individual choice to do so.



This week leading up to Remembrance Day, we remember and honour the brave men and women who served our beautiful country; those who are responsible for our freedom. Their sacrifices will never be forgotten. Let's fill the silence with thanks, honour, and heartfelt respect for every veteran's sacrifice.

I encourage you to attend local services around our great province. At the 11th hour, on the 11th day, of the 11th month, we will remember.



The Poppy should be worn with respect on the left side, over the heart. The Legion's lapel Poppy is a sacred symbol of Remembrance and should not be affixed with any pin that obstructs the Poppy.

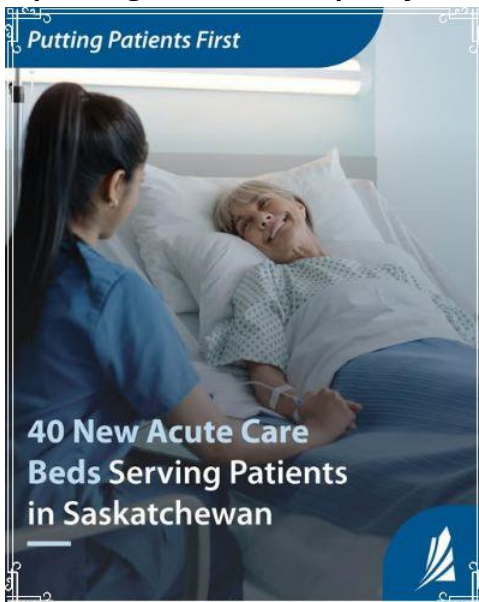

PATIENTS TO BENEFIT FROM 40 NEW BEDS AT SASKATOON CITY HOSPITAL



It was a pleasure to attend the announcement marking a major milestone in expanding health care capacity in Saskatoon.



The Government of Saskatchewan and the Saskatchewan Health Authority (SHA) marked an important milestone in expanding acute care capacity in the province's

largest city. A major expansion at Saskatoon City Hospital (SCH) will add a total 109 new acute care beds when completed. The first 40 beds, part of a new medicine unit on the hospital's sixth floor, are now open and serving patients.

“By expanding acute care capacity at City Hospital, we are delivering solutions that put patients first while supporting the dedicated staff who provide that care every day,” Health Minister Jeremy Cockrill said. “This expansion will help ease pressure across Saskatoon’s acute care network and enhance the experience for patients and families, as we continue strengthening access to timely, high-quality care across Saskatchewan.”

SASKATCHEWAN ANNOUNCES THE CREATION OF THE SASKATCHEWAN MEMORIAL EMBLEM TO HONOUR FALLEN PUBLIC SAFETY PERSONNEL

The Government of Saskatchewan is announcing the creation of a new provincial award - the Saskatchewan Memorial Emblem - to recognize the sacrifices of public safety personnel who have lost their lives in the line of duty.

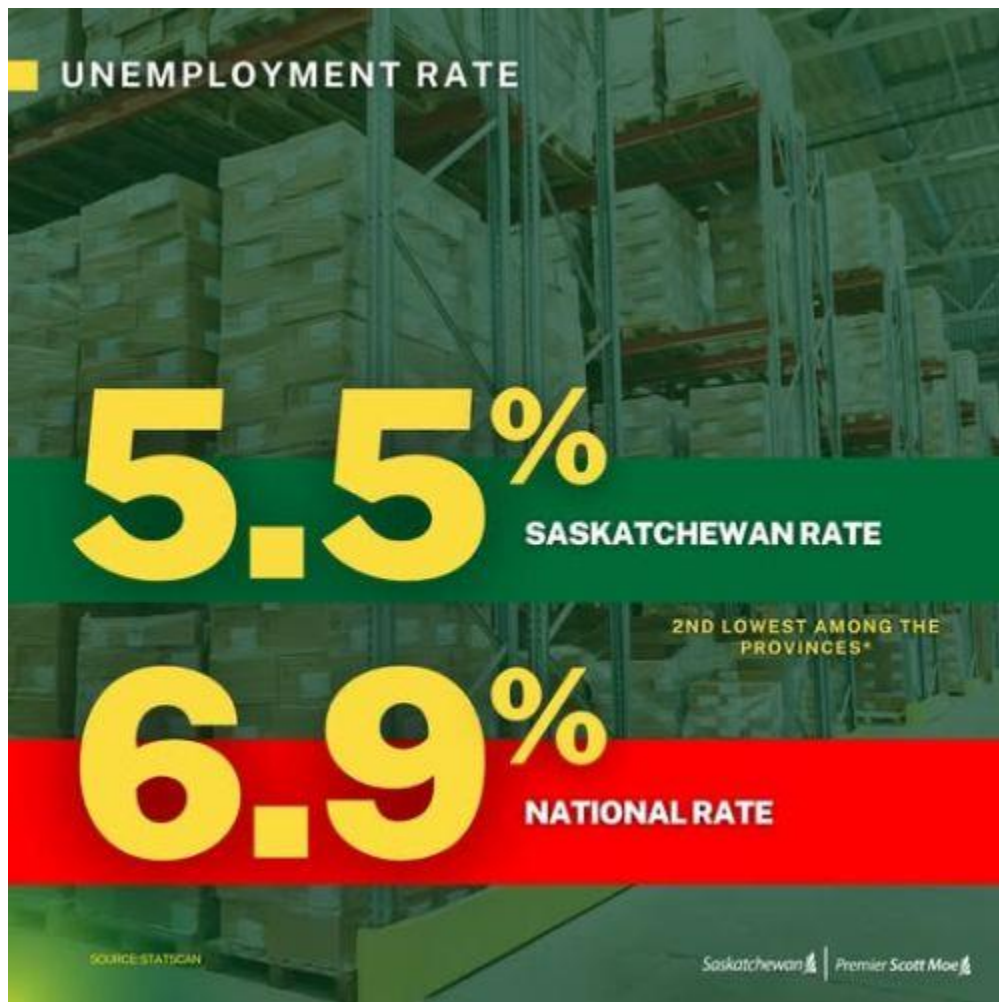
This emblem will comprise a medallion, a scroll, and a miniature pin that can be worn by a family member or designated recipient of the fallen. The design of the Memorial Emblem will be unveiled at a later date.

"An extraordinary debt of gratitude is owed to all of our public safety personnel," Corrections, Policing and Public Safety Minister Tim McLeod said. "The Saskatchewan Memorial Emblem will complement the recently announced Saskatchewan Protective Services Memorial in Regina, symbolizing the province's enduring appreciation for those who have laid down their lives while preserving the safety and security of all Saskatchewan residents."

The names of those honoured with the Saskatchewan Memorial Emblem will be recorded in a Register and etched on the Saskatchewan Protective Services Memorial in the Legislative Precinct in Regina.

The province will be engaging with public safety stakeholders to consult on the Emblem's nomination process and eligibility criteria.

UNEMPLOYMENT DOWN TO 5.5 PER CENT IN OCTOBER, 14,000 JOBS CREATED IN SASKATCHEWAN



Statistics Canada's latest labour force numbers show that the labour market in Saskatchewan remains strong with 14,000 jobs added year-over-year in October, an increase of 2.3 per cent, the second highest amongst provinces. Saskatchewan's unemployment rate is the second lowest amongst provinces at 5.5 per cent, well below the national average of 6.9 per cent.

"Saskatchewan continues to have one of the lowest unemployment rates in Canada as our economy creates more jobs and opportunities in the province," Deputy Premier and Minister of Immigration and Career Training Jim Reiter said. "Our government is here to support a strong labour force to fill the jobs being created, so Saskatchewan continues to be the best place to live, work and raise a family."

SASKATCHEWAN HIGHWAY PATROL INVESTIGATION LEADS TO SEIZURE OF 46 KILOGRAMS OF METHAMPHETAMINE AND 4.2 MILLION CIGARETTES



Recent successful investigations by the Saskatchewan Highway Patrol (SHP), including a major seizure of illicit drugs and contraband cigarettes, are highlighting the growing impact of the SHP in enhancing public safety across the province. SHP officers continue to play a key role in traffic enforcement, commercial vehicle safety and supporting broader law enforcement efforts in Saskatchewan.

On October 29, 2025, a westbound commercial vehicle was stopped for a vehicle safety inspection at the Langham weigh scale station near Saskatoon. Upon further inspection, it was determined that the vehicle was carrying illicit drugs and contraband cigarettes. RCMP was immediately engaged and laid charges in the investigation, which led to the seizure of approximately 46 kilograms of methamphetamine and approximately 4.2 million unstamped cigarettes.

"Thank you to the Saskatchewan Highway Patrol for your work to keep our province safe and remove these harmful drugs from communities," Corrections, Policing and

Public Safety Minister Tim McLeod, K.C. said. "Their work, alongside RCMP and other law enforcement agencies, help keep drugs off our streets and make Saskatchewan communities safe and secure."

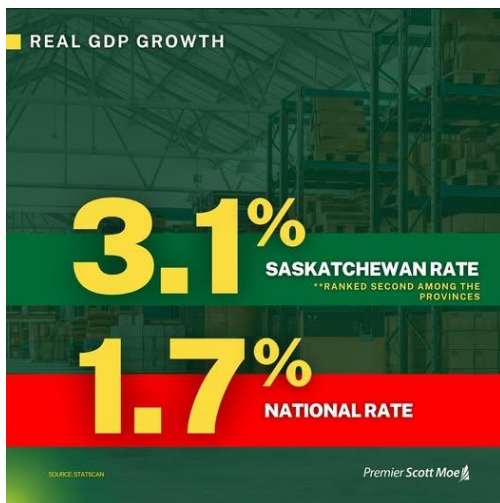
Saskatchewan's GDP Reaches \$83.6B

Ranking 2nd Among the Provinces for Growth

Province's 2024 GDP growth rate is highest year on record

As the end of 2025 nears, Saskatchewan continues to stand out as a national economic leader. Statistics Canada's latest real GDP data shows the province's real GDP grew by 3.1 per cent from 2023 to 2024 reaching \$83.6 billion. This outpaces the national average of 1.7 per cent and is the highest year record for the province. This ranks the province 2nd among Canadian provinces for growth in 2024.



"Saskatchewan has one of the strongest economies in Canada, and these results show the benefits are reaching families, workers, and communities alike," Minister of Trade and Export Development Warren Kaeding said. "We are building a province where life is affordable, communities are safe, students are supported and can count on health care services. Our continued economic growth is what allows us to invest in these priorities while keeping Saskatchewan competitive and secure for the future."

SASKATCHEWAN INTRODUCES LEGISLATION TO MODERNIZE DEFAMATION LAWS



The Government of Saskatchewan has introduced *The Defamation Act, 2025*, to modernize and simplify the province's defamation laws. The new Act replaces the century-old *Libel and Slander Act*, which has been in place since 1909, to reflect today's media landscape and ensure that the law effectively addresses online and digital communications.

"The way information is shared has changed dramatically since 1909," Justice Minister and Attorney General Tim McLeod, K.C. said. "This new Act ensures that the rights of Saskatchewan people are secure and protected in the digital age, whether speech occurs in print, in broadcast, or online. It strikes a balance between freedom of expression and the protection of reputation."
