

REPORT FROM THE LEGISLATURE



Your Saskatchewan Party government is using the benefits of our strong economy to increase investments in essential programs and services. In health care, we will see investment to expand our workforce, perform more surgeries and improve services to rural areas.

Our Health Human Resource Action Plan has already seen success as we work to recruit, train, incentivize and retain health professionals. The positive response started immediately following the announcement of adding over 1,000 professionals to the healthcare system. In the following weeks, we received hundreds of international applications alongside resumes from locally trained professionals. Over 125 new, full-time frontline positions were created, with another 50 part-time spots enhanced to full-time. These new opportunities will support 49 communities across the province.

The recruitment plan also includes local students as the Saskatchewan Health Authority continues to promote the benefits of a healthcare career. HealthCareersinSask.ca has listings for hundreds of jobs from all corners of the province, while recruitment professionals host career fairs to speak to potential graduates.

In support of these efforts, our government has organized a targeted recruitment mission to Manila, Philippines. The team will promote healthcare employment opportunities through workshops and information sessions. As part of this initiative, a new webpage on Saskatchewan.ca/hhr will help potential candidates preregister for sessions with the delegation, learn about other Filipino healthcare workers in Saskatchewan and apply for opportunities.

More frontline staff will directly support our ability to perform more surgeries. This fiscal year we have set an aggressive target of performing 97,000 surgeries which would be the highest number of surgeries ever completed in one year. To help reach this target, we are increasing the surgical capacity in Regina, Saskatoon and at regional hospitals. In addition, we will continue to work with public hospitals and partner with publicly funded private surgical providers.

Our government was pleased to announce the selection of The John Howard Society of Saskatchewan (JHSS) to coordinate and integrate services that will meet the needs of youth aged 12 to 25. Integrated Youth Services is an international reimagining of how youth and their families access the resources, services and support they need. JHSS will create a one-stop shop that provides rapid access to youth-targeted supports with a focus on prevention and early intervention. Services will include mental health support, substance misuse information, peer support, primary care, education, employment and training and social and community services.

The colder weather is now upon us, and residents are encouraged to take steps to support their health this winter. Flu shots are still available through public health clinics, pharmacies and some local health offices. OVER 2,000 MORE REGULATED CHILD CARE SPACES TO OPEN IN SASKATCHEWAN



The Governments of Saskatchewan and Canada are investing \$28.9 million to develop up to 2,197 new childcare spaces in regulated childcare centres across the province.

"Today our government is pleased to announce a significant expansion in regulated childcare, which is so important to Saskatchewan families," Minister of Education Dustin Duncan said. "In our growing province, we are providing funding for nearly 2,200 more children to attend regulated childcare, which provides high quality early learning, play and exploration environments for our youngest learners."

Of the 2,197 newly funded spaces, 1,599 spaces have been allocated to specific organizations who will either build new facilities or add new spaces within their existing facilities.

CREATING AN ACCESSIBLE SASKATCHEWAN




The Government of Saskatchewan introduced new legislation to prevent and remove accessibility barriers for persons with disabilities.

If passed, *The Accessible Saskatchewan Act* will allow government to establish accessibility standards and regulations in the following areas: the built environment, information and communications, employment, transportation, service animals, procurement and service delivery.

"Yesterday's introduction marks another important step in creating a more inclusive and accessible province for all people in Saskatchewan," Social Services Minister Gene Makowsky said. "As we proceed on this journey, we remain committed to the principle of 'Nothing about us, without us' and will continue to engage with persons with disabilities on this important work. We are working to create a Saskatchewan where persons with disabilities can fully participate because a strong province is one where everyone is included."

BE ICE SMART THIS WINTER



With the arrival of snow and colder temperatures, the Water Security Agency is reminding the public to ensure that ice is thick enough to safely walk, drive or snowmobile on.

"As people get ready to enjoy another season on the ice, their safety is always top of mind for the Government of Saskatchewan," Minister Responsible for the Water Security Agency Jeremy Cockrill said. "We recommend checking ice thickness each and every time you venture on our provincial waters to ensure you are safe this winter.

Ice thickness can be deceptive and unpredictable at times. It does not freeze at a uniform thickness and its strength can vary considerably from one area to another.

To be sure, check the ice thickness before you travel on it. As a guideline, you need at least 10 cm (four inches) of ice to walk on, 20 cm (eight inches) to drive a snowmobile or ATV on, 30 cm (12 inches) to drive a car or light truck on, and more than 30 cm (12 inches) to support a heavy truck.

SPSA, MLTC SIGN LETTER OF UNDERSTANDING FOR EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS AND RESPONSE



November 16, the Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency (SPSA) signed a Letter of Understanding (LOU) with Meadow Lake Tribal Council (MLTC) to clarify the emergency management roles and responsibilities of both parties.

"It gives us an opportunity to build capacity and eventually take control of managing emergencies as they arise," Cree Vice Chief Richard Derocher said. "I am extremely thrilled that the Meadow Lake Tribal Council is acting on the best interests of our member nations by entering into a Letter of Understanding with the SPSA."

The LOU, which will remain in effect until 2027, provides opportunities for increased coordination before, during and after an emergency. Having an activation plan and timely communication between emergency partners is critical to public safety and enhancing effective emergency management.

SASKATCHEWAN HOUSING STARTS UP 78 PER CENT



Saskatchewan's economy continues to show impressive growth with urban housing starts increasing by 78 per cent between October 2021 and October 2022, ranking second among the provinces.

"Saskatchewan's strong economy continues to be one of the best in the nation," Trade and Export Development Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "Today's increase in housing starts is significant and is adding to a long list of impressive economic indicators over the last several months."

Saskatchewan has ranked first in Canada in several other key economic indicators in recent months. Earlier this week, Statistics Canada reported a 49.5 per cent jump in wholesale trade for September 2022, compared to September 2021, while that same period saw the value of building construction increase by 56.2 per cent, and merchandise exports up by 45 per cent.

FOURTH FLIGHT OF UKRAINIANS FILLED IN UNDER FOUR DAYS



230 Additional Displaced Ukrainians to Touch Down Later in November

Following the November 10 opening of registration for the fourth humanitarian flight from Ukraine, Open Arms has confirmed that another 230 Ukrainians have been registered for the November 23 flight.

"Saskatchewan has seen a tremendous response to the fourth application window, with all 230 seats on the fourth flight filled in under four days," Minister of Immigration and Career Training Jeremy Harrison said. "The Government of Saskatchewan is ready for the next wave of Ukrainian families with many supports in place for their upcoming arrival. Saskatchewan will continue to support Ukraine and its people for as long as needed."

This will be the fourth flight of Ukrainian refugees but the first to land in Saskatoon.

On August 12, Premier Scott Moe joined representatives from Solidaire and Open Arms, to sign a memorandum of understanding (MOU). The MOU is a pledge by the three parties to partner on a maximum of five humanitarian flights into Saskatchewan by March 31, 2023.

Upon arriving in Saskatchewan, passengers will have access to settlement services as they transition to life in Saskatchewan. Planning is underway for the flight's arrival.






