

CRUCIAL WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT ZONES TARGETED FOR CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE TESTING



Are you hunting deer, moose or elk this season? If you plan to hunt in wildlife management zones 2W, 9, 10, 35, 37 or 50, the Ministry of Environment encourages you to submit your animals for chronic wasting disease (CWD) testing. These zones - the boreal transition zones and those along the eastern border - are specifically targeted for testing this year, as there is a risk of the disease expanding in these areas.

"Saskatchewan offers some of the best hunting opportunities in the world and hunters in our province play an essential role in the detection and surveillance of chronic wasting disease," Environment Minister Dana Skoropad said. "Submitting animals for testing helps the ministry monitor and manage the spread of disease, which helps keep overall wildlife populations healthy and hunting opportunities strong."

SASKATCHEWAN TO PROVIDE CHILD INCOME SUPPORT
BENEFITS TO UKRAINIAN NEWCOMERS



The Government of Saskatchewan announced today that families in Saskatchewan through the Canada-Ukraine Authorization for Emergency Travel (CUAET) are now eligible for additional income support benefits to help with the cost of raising children under 18 years of age.

The Ministry of Social Services has expanded eligibility for the Child Basic Benefit under the Saskatchewan Income Support (SIS) program and the Transitional Benefit for Children under the Saskatchewan Assured Income for Disability (SAID) program.

"The Government of Saskatchewan continues to support Ukrainian newcomers and help them settle into life in our province," Social Services Minister Gene Makowsky said. "Expanding the Child Basic Benefit to eligible Ukrainian families will provide them with the additional support they need to take care of their families during a very challenging time in their lives."

SEASONS CHANGE BUT TICKS REMAIN



The Ministry of Health is reminding Saskatchewan residents to remain vigilant for ticks on themselves and their pets this fall.

While blacklegged ticks (*Ixodes scapularis*) are rare in Saskatchewan, they remain active throughout fall. Blacklegged ticks are found in tall grass, brush or wooded areas. In this province, any ticks found in the fall are likely to be blacklegged ticks, which can cause Lyme disease.

"It's important to stay vigilant against ticks when outdoors, even though summer is over," Deputy Chief Medical Health Officer Dr. Julie Kryzanowski said. "The risk for contracting Lyme disease in Saskatchewan is low, but not zero. Remember to protect yourself, your family and your pets against ticks."


