

What a pleasure this past week to welcome the first students to the Master of Physician Assistant Studies program. It is indeed a proud moment for Saskatchewan. As Minister of Advanced Education, this program reflects our governments commitment to expanding high-quality, locally delivered education that meets the evolving needs of our communities and creates rewarding career pathways for Saskatchewan students.

Saskatchewan is taking another step forward in strengthening its health care workforce with the launch of a new training program for Physician Assistants (PAs). Twenty new students have joined the University of Saskatchewan's (USask) College of Medicine in the first cohort of the new Master of Physician Assistant

Studies (MPAS) program. This milestone is a bold step in Saskatchewan's plan to train and recruit PAs right here at home.

PAs are health professionals who have taken advanced training to practise medicine under the supervision of a licensed physician, often within a multidisciplinary health team.

"Welcoming the first students to the Master of Physician Assistant Studies program is a proud moment for Saskatchewan," Advanced Education Minister Ken Cheveldayoff said. "This program reflects our commitment to expanding high-quality, locally delivered education that meets the evolving needs of our communities and creates rewarding career pathways for Saskatchewan students."

The NSBA hosted an excellent evening at Mosaic in Regina for Popcorn and Entrepreneurs II.


The evening was a first for Regina. It was an incredible evening celebrating Paul and Carol Hill. It was wonderful that several colleagues were in attendance.

SCHOOL PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT GRANT ANNOUNCEMENT



I had the pleasure of representing our government to announce the launch of the province's new School Playground Equipment Grant program, which has begun accepting applications. The program aims to support the creation of safe, accessible playgrounds on school-operated property throughout Saskatchewan. Eligible projects can receive up to \$50,000 in matching funds to build a new playground or use funds to add new equipment or replace existing components.



Minster of Parks, Culture and Sport Alana Ross held a similar event in Regina.

The application period for the School Playground Equipment Grant program is now open.

With a \$3.75M annual investment over the next four years, this program will support the creation of safe, accessible playgrounds on school property throughout Saskatchewan.

Eligible projects can receive up to \$50,000 in matching funds, available on a first-come, first-served basis and will be administered in partnership with the Saskatchewan Parks and Recreation Association (SPRA).

The online grant application and supporting guidelines will be available through the SPRA Online Grant Platform at https://www.spra.sk.ca/funding/spra-grants/.

PROVINCE OFFERS GRANTS TO SUPPORT SUICIDE PREVENTION



As part of Pillars for Life: The Saskatchewan Suicide Prevention Plan, the provincial government is providing \$250,000 in grants to support suicide prevention initiatives across the province.

The Suicide Prevention Grant Program encourages community partners to develop creative ways to support suicide prevention, with a focus on developing leadership, reducing risks of suicide, increasing awareness of resources, reducing stigma and promoting healthy lifestyles. Funding will support at least 25 grants, each receiving up to \$10,000.

"The tragic loss of a person by suicide is felt by family members, friends, and the entire community," Mental Health and Addictions Minister Lori Carr said.

"Addressing self-harm and suicide is a priority for our government. Providing these grants is an important way to work with partners to support the mental health of our residents across the province."

KEEP OUR CHILDREN SAFE - TRAFFIC TIP




Watch for flashing lights and stop signs around school buses.

SASKATCHEWAN RECOGNIZES LIVING ORGAN DONATION WEEK





UPGRADED SASKATCHEWAN AIR AMBULANCE AIRCRAFT IMPROVES PATIENT CARE AND SAFETY



The Government of Saskatchewan has upgraded one of its Saskatchewan Air Ambulance (SAA) aircraft to better serve patients with complex and urgent medical needs.

The King Air B200 aircraft now has a larger entry door, a bigger stretcher with a new support system and an electronic lift. The interior of the plane has also been upgraded to accommodate these changes. These improvements make it safer and easier for emergency responders to move patients on and off the aircraft, supporting

faster and more efficient emergency transport across the province. The upgraded stretcher also allows for safe and timely care for patients who may not be adequately supported with conventional stretchers.

"Upgrading this aircraft reflects our continued commitment to investing in infrastructure that supports the health and wellbeing of all residents, no matter where patients live - whether in the far north or in the south," SaskBuilds and Procurement Minister David Marit said. "This investment highlights our promise to support communities across Saskatchewan."




RECORD HIGH LABOUR FORCE NUMBERS




CROP REPORT FOR THE PERIOD SEPTEMBER 2 TO SEPTEMBER 8, 2025



Producers were able to make significant harvest progress over the past week, although some areas experienced rain delays. Currently, 41 per cent of this year's crop is in the bin, up from 23 per cent reported last week. This is behind the five-year average of 58 per cent and the 10-year average of 49 per cent. Although the mostly dry weather has allowed harvest to progress, combine and equipment fires are a significant risk. Producers are also monitoring stored grain closely as there are concerns for bin heating given the high temperatures that occurred at the time of combining.




