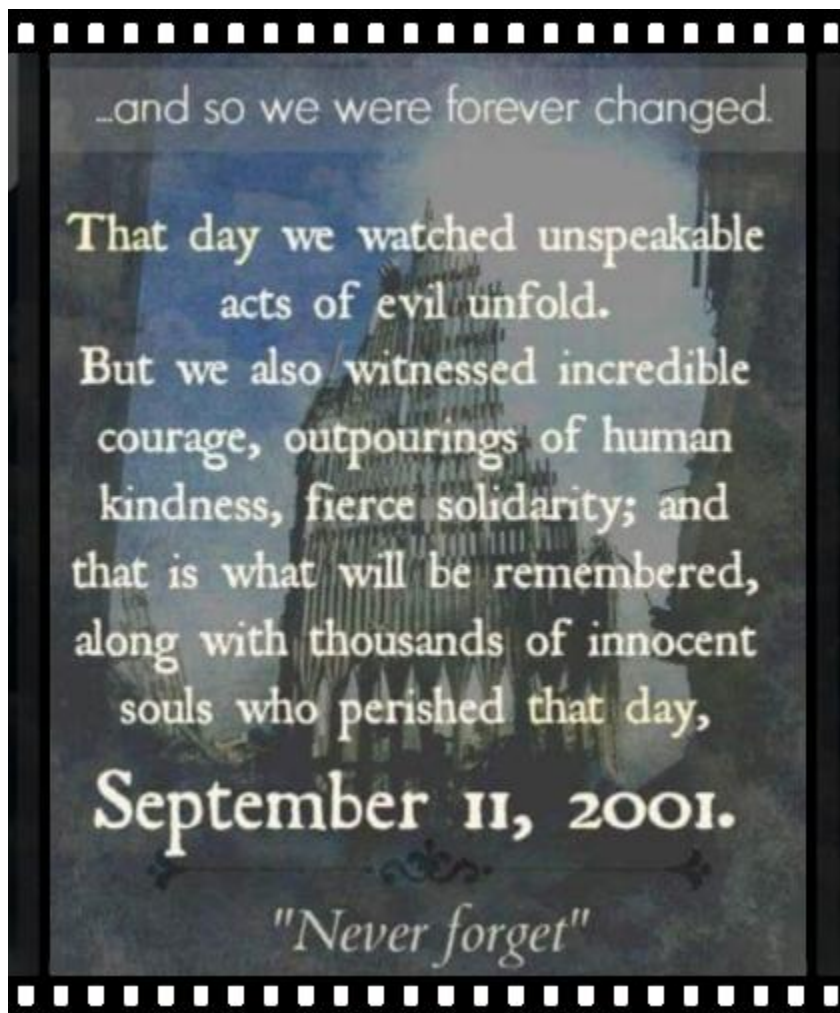

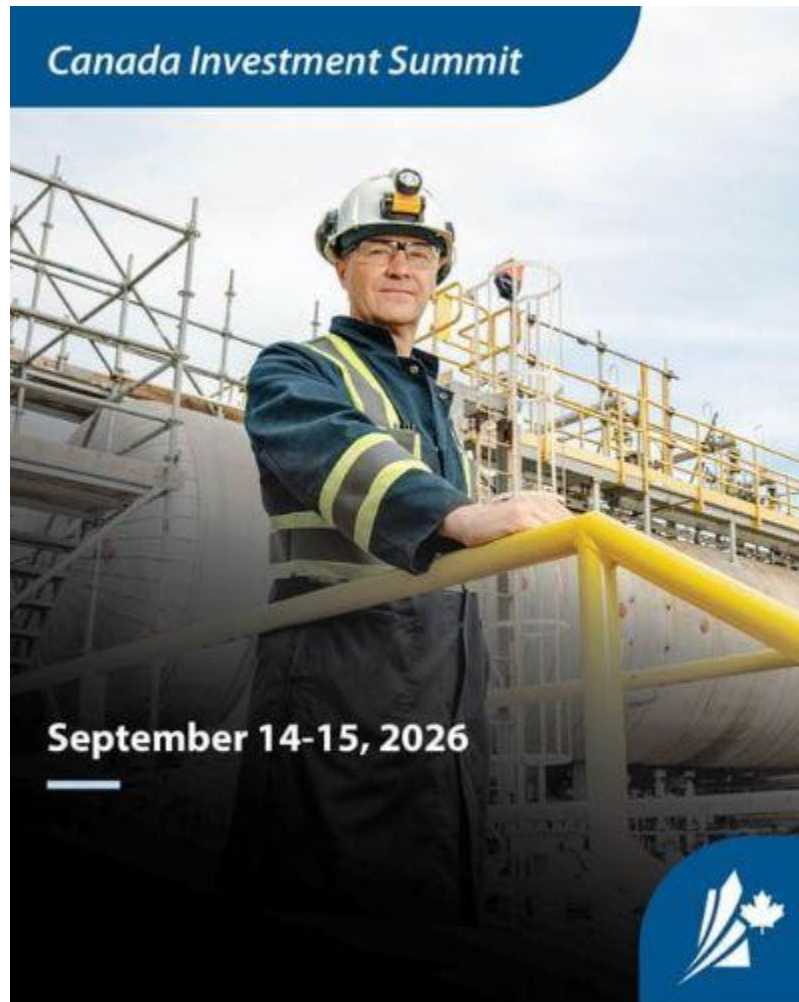

Saskatchewan Leads the Nation in Private Capital Investment

Premier Scott Moe is heading to Toronto to attend the Canada Investment Summit where he will promote investment opportunities in Saskatchewan's energy, critical mineral, defence and agriculture sectors. The event, which takes place on September 14 and 15, brings together prominent investors, CEOs, entrepreneurs and business leaders from around the world. It is aimed at attracting new investment into Canada as a way of growing the national economy.

"The world is uncertain, Saskatchewan is not," Moe said. "It is clear the time to invest in our province is now. There is no place better positioned to help meet the world's demand for food, fuel, fertilizer and critical minerals. By taking our story directly to investors, we are bringing opportunities home, creating jobs and building the strongest provincial economy in Canada."

**WITH SCHOOL UNDERWAY, PLEASE TAKE TIME TO TALK TO YOUR FAMILY
MEMBERS ABOUT BULLYING**



Copied, but appropriate to share:

With a new school year underway, I want to ask you a favour. Sit with your child for 5 minutes and explain that there is never a reason to make fun of someone for their high, their weight, their skin ton, their home life or the things they enjoy.

Explain there's nothing wrong with wearing the seam clothes and shoes every day. Explain to them that a used backpack carried the same dreams as a new one. Teach them to not to exclude anything for "being different". Explain to them that teasing hurls and that they are at school to learn, not to spread negativity.

Remind them some kids don't go home to loving families so it's important to

be kind.

Bullying can be:

- **Verbal:** usually involving taunts, name-calling, put-downs, slurs, offensive gestures, incessant mocking, threats, intimidation and laughing at someone else's expense;
- **Social:** excluding, ganging up, ridiculing, gossiping, spreading rumours, extortion or stealing of money and possessions;
- **Physical:** involving physical harm often from kicking, punching, hair pulling, pinching and pushing;
- **Sexual:** involving unwanted physical contact or sexually inappropriate comments; and
- **Cyber:** using a computer or other technology to forward or spread hurtful messages and/or images.

PREMIER SCOTT MOE AT THE WORLD NUCLEAR SYMPOSIUM THIS WEEK

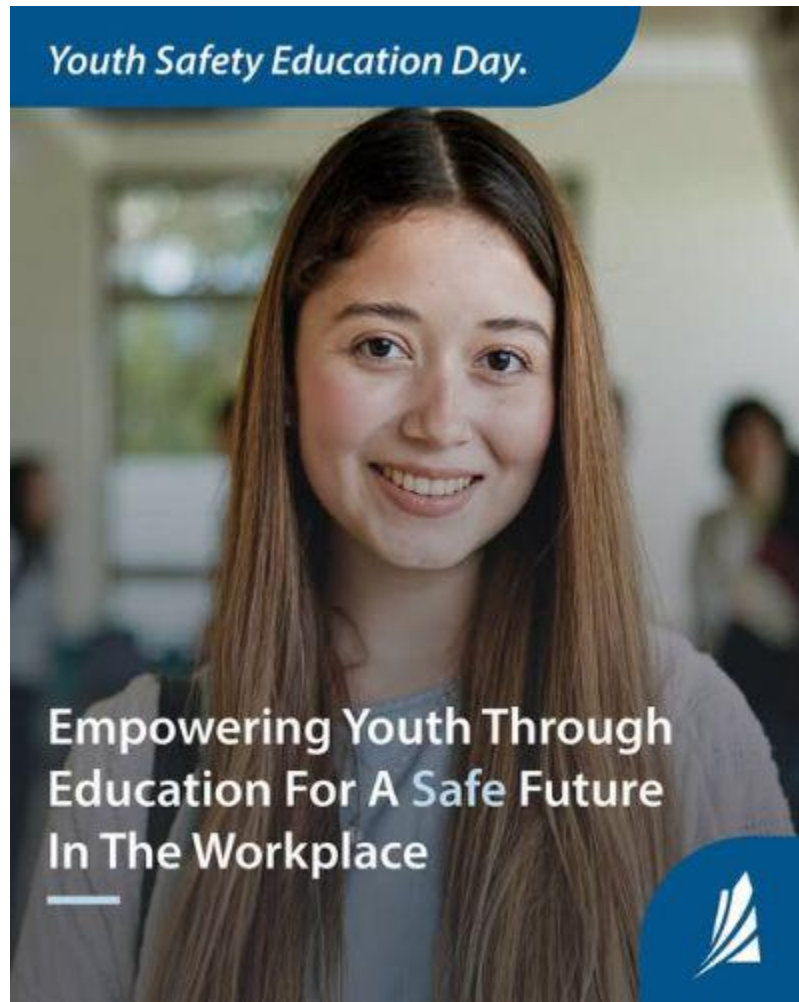

"The Saskatchewan Protective Services Medal recognizes the outstanding contributions of protective services personnel," Martens said. 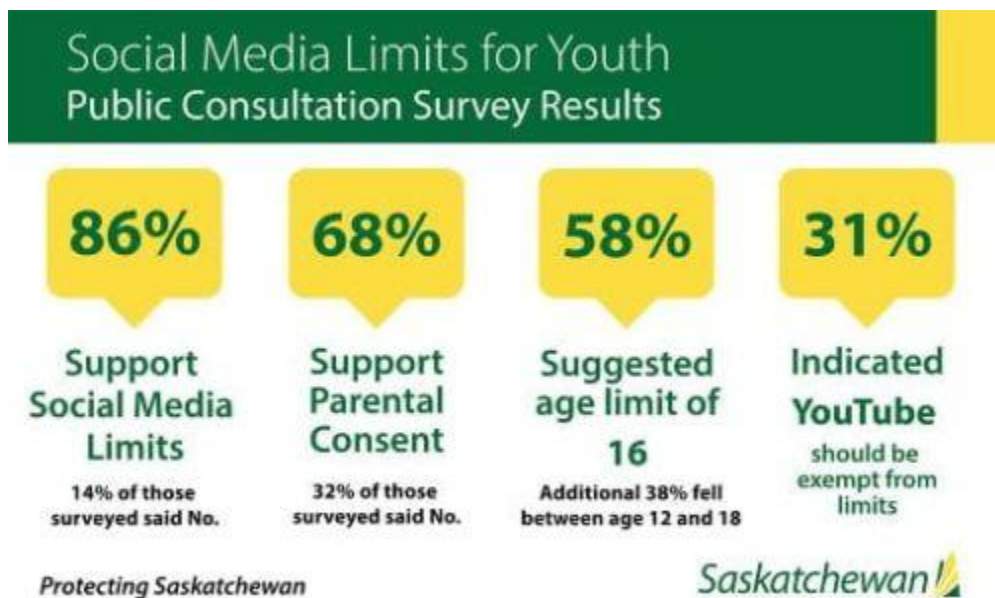
This year, 204 individuals will receive the Saskatchewan Protective Services Medal in recognition of 25 or more years of exemplary service in the province. Recipients represent a wide range of protective service professions, including police, fire, federal and provincial corrections, border services, Royal Canadian Mounted Police, Canadian Armed Forces and mobile crisis and family violence outreach services.

In addition to the medal ceremony today in Saskatoon, two more Saskatchewan Protective Services Medal ceremonies will be held in Regina later this month.

Recipients receive a circular medal surmounted by St. Edward's Crown and a certificate signed by the Lieutenant Governor, Premier and Provincial Secretary. The medal bears the motto Qui civitatem tuentur (who guard the citizenry).

SASKATCHEWAN RESIDENTS SUPPORT SOCIAL MEDIA LIMITS FOR YOUTH



The results are in from the province-wide survey seeking Saskatchewan residents' opinions on social media limits for youth.

The Government of Saskatchewan received responses from communities across the province showing public support for increased safeguards online.

Of those who responded to the question, "Do you support social media limits for children under the age of 16?" 86.34 per cent answered yes, while 13.66 per cent answered no.

"Thank you to the thousands of Saskatchewan residents who took the time to share their views," Mental Health and Addictions Minister Lori Carr said. "The results have been shared with the Federal Government and the feedback received will help inform Saskatchewan's participation in broader discussions regarding online safety and the wellbeing of young people."

The survey sought feedback on potential restrictions for major social media platforms, including TikTok, Facebook, Instagram, YouTube and Snapchat.

SASKATCHEWAN ADDS 2,600 JOBS IN AUGUST



While the rest of Canada lost nearly 42,000 jobs in August, Saskatchewan's strong, steady economy created 2,600 jobs. Saskatchewan's unemployment

rate is the third lowest amongst provinces at 6.0 per cent, below the national average of 6.4 per cent.

"Saskatchewan's strong, steady economy continues to outpace the rest of Canada," Immigration and Career Training Minister Eric Schmalz said. "By working with industry and supporting workers, we are building the workforce our economy needs today and into the future."

PHARMACIES**

Over 100 pharmacies



Strep Throat & Ear Infection Services Program



The Government of Saskatchewan has expanded strep throat and ear infection services to over 100 pharmacies. Pharmacists at select locations across the province have been trained to assess symptoms, perform rapid testing for strep throat, and determine appropriate treatment options, including prescribing medication. The strep throat and ear infection services program supports the Patient First Health Care Plan by improving access to care through community pharmacies.

All eligible pharmacies that applied through the provincial intake in July have been accepted, adding 55 new locations across Saskatchewan. By January 2027, strep throat and ear services will be available in 34 communities. 71

pharmacies will offer both strep throat and ear services and 31 offering ear services only.

"This expansion provides more timely access to assessment and treatment, aligning with our goals under the Patients First Plan," Rural and Remote Health Minister Lori Carr said. "The strong response to the Strep Throat and Ear Infection Program is encouraging. Through this expansion, pharmacists will play a significant role in enhancing access to quality care for patients as close to home as possible."

The Government of Saskatchewan is awarding 44 grants to community partners to support suicide prevention initiatives across the province.

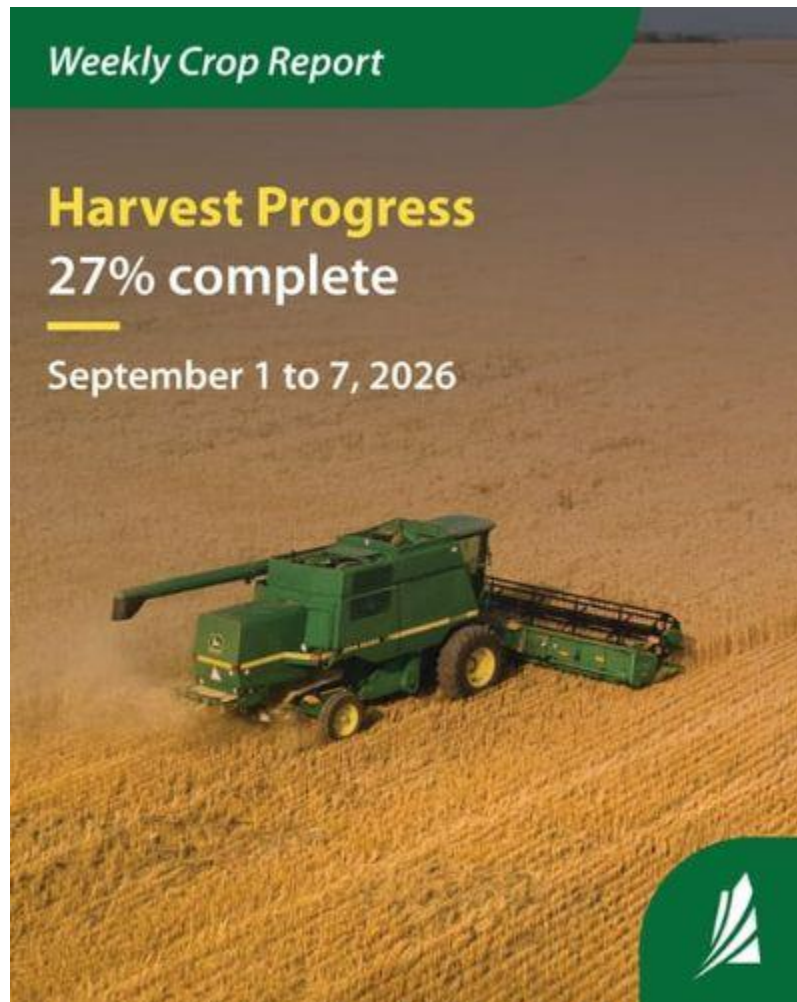
The Suicide Prevention Grant Program encourages community partners to develop creative ways to support suicide prevention, with a focus on training and skills development, increasing awareness of resources, reducing stigma, and helping communities to take action.

"Suicide is a serious issue that affects many families and communities across Saskatchewan," Mental Health and Addictions Minister Lori Carr said. "I am encouraged by the strong response from groups across the province to the Suicide Prevention Grant Program. These grants are an important way to

collaborate with partners to support the mental health of Saskatchewan residents."

CROP REPORT FOR THE PERIOD SEPTEMBER 1 TO 7, 2026



Harvest progress was made earlier in the week before widespread rainfall stalled field operations across much of the province. Currently, 27 per cent of

the crop is in the bin, up from 18 per cent last week. This is behind the five-year average of 58 per cent harvested and the 10-year average of 50 per cent.

Large amounts of precipitation were recorded throughout the province and field work will be on hold until it is dry enough to continue. The RM of Longlaketon recorded 138 millimetres (mm), the RM of Eyebrow recorded 132 mm, the RM of Sarnia recorded 127 mm and the RM of McKillop recorded 121 mm. Fields are generally saturated in many regions and producers are hoping for warm, dry weather going forward. Topsoil moisture increased in cropland, hayland and pastures this past week.

BEFORE BATS MOVE IN, TAKE STEPS TO KEEP THEM OUT



As cooler nights roll in across Saskatchewan, bats may begin looking for warmer homes to settle into for the winter.

September is an ideal time for home and cabin owners to prepare their properties for winter. As temperatures drop, a variety of animals such as bats, squirrels, or pigeons may seek shelter in warm, protected spaces. Taking steps to prevent bats and wildlife from entering buildings now can help property owners avoid dealing with unwanted house guests after they have already moved in.

"Bats are an important part of Saskatchewan's ecosystem and help protect crops, forests, parks and gardens by feeding on insect pests," Environment Minister Darlene Rowden said. "When bats take shelter in buildings, it is important that property owners understand how and when they can be safely removed. September gives property owners an opportunity to safely encourage bats to move along to a new home before winter sets in."

**GOVERNMENT OF SASKATCHEWAN STRENGTHENS PARTNERSHIP WITH
ROADWAYS LITERACY ACADEMY TO SUPPORT STUDENT LITERACY**

The Government of Saskatchewan is strengthening its partnership with Roadways Literacy Academy through increased funding and a new service agreement that will support literacy programming and intensive services for students with specific learning disabilities.

Beginning in the 2026-27 school year, Roadways Literacy Academy will operate as an alternative independent school and receive \$403,000 in funding through a service agreement with the Ministry of Education. This represents an increase of \$175,000 over previous funding levels.

"This enhanced funding reflects our government's confidence in Roadways Literacy Academy's proven results and our shared commitment to helping more Saskatchewan students build the literacy skills they need to succeed," Education Minister Everett Hindley said. "Strong literacy skills create opportunities for lifelong learning and success. Through this partnership, we

are helping students overcome learning challenges and build the skills and confidence that will help them to reach their full potential."
