FREE FISHING THIS FAMILY DAY WEEKEND!

Saskatchewan's annual winter free fishing weekend once again coincides with the province's Family Day holiday weekend on February 17, 18 and 19.

Saskatchewan's public waters are open one weekend each winter to encourage participation in ice fishing. Both residents and visitors may fish in any waterbody that has an open sport fishing season, without purchasing a fishing license.

"Ice fishing is an excellent way to enjoy nature with family and friends during the winter,"

Environment Minister Dustin Duncan said. "Our lakes attract more than 250,000 anglers each year and the free fishing weekend is the perfect opportunity for both new and experienced anglers."

Anglers are reminded to use caution and common sense, and always put safety first when going out on frozen lakes. This includes testing the ice thickness before travelling on it. A minimum of 10 cm of good ice is required for walking and 30 cm for light vehicle travel. Wear warm clothing.

PREMIER SCOTT MOE ANNOUNCES IMMEDIATE EDUCATION FUNDING OF \$7.5 MILLION FOR SASKATCHEWAN CLASSROOMS

Premier Scott Moe announced immediate mid-school year funding of \$7.5 million that will be provided to school divisions to assist in dealing with front line pressures.

The funding will allow school divisions to hire education professionals immediately. This funding comes earlier than committed and will increase to \$30 million directed to hiring 400 in-school education professionals and other school board priorities once annualized in the 2018-19 budget.

"Over the last several months, I have heard from parents and educators that additional funding is essential to ensure that our children receive the highest quality education possible," Premier Moe said. "This \$7.5 million in immediate funding will put essential classroom supports in place before we introduce the full amount of \$30 million in the 2018-19 budget."

"I fundamentally believe that not a wheel turns in our economy without quality education and that societies that prosper and succeed are those that invest in education," Deputy Premier and Education Minister Gordon Wyant said. "Premier Moe and I are committed to ensuring Saskatchewan students have the supports they need to succeed and today's announcement is just the beginning of a renewed and respectful relationship with our teachers and education partners."

"Saskatchewan's school boards greatly appreciate increased funding to support the students in our province's education system," President of the Saskatchewan School Boards Association (SSBA) Dr. Shawn Davidson said. "We hope this announcement signals that the 2018-19 provincial budget will provide the restored and renewed investment that is critically needed in school division operating budgets."

The funding will be distributed through the Ministry of Education by way of the current education funding formula using the components that directly provide supports for the classroom. The Ministry will work closely with school divisions to ensure the mid-school year funding increase is distributed as quickly as possible.

CANADA 150 LEGACY BOARD GAME UNVEILED


Grade Eight students around Saskatchewan are being provided with a fun, educational way to remember Canada's 150th Anniversary of Confederation with the launch of the It's Democracy! board game.

The Canada 150 legacy project was undertaken by the Provincial Capital Commission, with financial support from the Government of Canada through the Lieutenant Governor's Office.

"The game can be used as a tool to help teach students about our democratic system of government, provincial history and leaders, and about our connection to the Crown," Minister

Responsible for the Provincial Capital Commission Ken Cheveldayoff said. "We're confident that the knowledge the students will gain from this valuable resource will leave a lasting impression. The It's Democracy! game is a fitting conclusion to a wonderful year of Canada 150 celebrations."

Produced in both official languages, the game is being supplied to approximately 700 public, separate and Band operated schools around the province. It was developed and designed in consultation with the Ministry of Education, a focus group of educators and other partners, with the Grade Eight social studies curriculum in mind.



HIGHEST URBAN HOUSING STARTS GROWTH IN CANADA

Urban housing starts in Saskatchewan rose 123.5 per cent in January 2018 when compared with January 2017, the highest percentage increase among the provinces according to Statistics Canada. Nationally, housing starts were up only 4.8 per cent.

Urban housing starts totaled 409 in January 2018, up from 183 in January 2017.

"These are exceptional figures for urban housing starts," Export and Trade Development Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "Compared to what is happening in the rest of the country, Saskatchewan's home building industry is starting the year off in great shape."

Five provinces had decreases in housing starts, while the western provinces were the only ones to see gains on a year-over-year percentage basis.

In Regina, housing starts were up 169.0 per cent year-over-year, while Saskatoon had an increase of 54.2 per cent.

Multiple dwellings were up 344 per cent year-over-year.

CELEBRATING TEACHERS AND SCHOOL STAFF IN SASKATCHEWAN



It's time to highlight the personal and professional contributions that teachers and school staff make for their students each day!



The Government of Saskatchewan has proclaimed February 11-17, 2018 as Teacher/Staff Appreciation Week in the province.

"This week is an opportunity for Saskatchewan residents to recognize and celebrate our teachers and school staff," Deputy Premier and Education Minister Gordon Wyant said. "Education professionals in our province work tirelessly to educate and inspire students to reach their full potential and engage in lifelong learning."

Teacher/Staff Appreciation Week is acknowledged annually across Canada to highlight the invaluable work of education professionals in our schools. This year, the Saskatchewan Association of School Councils (SASC) has chosen the theme *Inspiration Through Learning*.

"Teachers and staff inspire and motivate learners when they provide students with opportunities to understand, develop and practice positive attitudes and actions that will result in the achievements of their goals and dreams," SASC Director Joy Bastness said. "They inspire new understanding and skills, initiate new experiences, spark students' interest and enthusiasm, while infusing learning with life and a desire to learn."

This marks the 31st year that Teacher/Staff Appreciation Week will be celebrated in Saskatchewan.

SPRING RUNOFF EXPECTED TO BE BELOW NORMAL

February 8, the Water Security Agency (WSA) released the preliminary spring runoff outlook for 2018.


With the dry conditions in the summer and fall of 2017 combined with below normal winter precipitation so far, a below normal spring runoff is expected across southern Saskatchewan this year.

Conditions are near normal across northern areas of the province. Meadow Lake and the Upper Churchill River Basin is the exception with this region receiving extremely high rainfall in 2017 which created a wetter than normal landscape at freeze-up. This area is expected to experience normal to slightly above normal spring runoff in 2018.

The summer of 2017 saw extremely low rainfall across a large portion of southern Saskatchewan with record dry conditions in some locations. These conditions continued into the fall where precipitation was also below normal. As a result, soil moisture conditions were dry at freeze-up and significant wetland storage was available in many areas.

DECEMBER BUILDING PERMIT GROWTH LEADS THE WEST



According to Statistics Canada, December 2017 building permits were up considerably in Saskatchewan, rising 69.7 per cent year over year (seasonally adjusted), the second highest percentage increase among the provinces, and the highest percentage increase in western Canada. Nationally, permits were up only 11.5 per cent.

The total value of building permits in Saskatchewan was \$242 million.

"Saskatchewan's building permit growth rate in December was significantly higher than the national average," Export and Trade Development Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "This shows confidence in our economy in both the short and long term with jobs and investment."

I hope everyone enjoys a Happy Valentines Day. February 14 is a great day to remind us to show those we care about how much they mean to us.

A few fun facts about Valentine's Day:

- In order of popularity, Valentine's Day cards are given to teachers, children, mothers, wives, sweethearts and pets.
- On Valentine's Day every year, there are at least 36 million heart shape boxes of chocolates
- The red rose was the favourite flower of Venus, the Roman goddess of love.
- Worldwide, over 50 million roses are given for Valentine's Day each year.
- In the Middle Ages, young men and women drew names from a bowl to see who would be their Valentine. They would wear this name pinned onto their sleeves for one week for everyone to see. That was the origin of the expression "to wear your heart on your sleeve."
- Richard Cadbury invented the first Valentines Day candy box in the late 1800's.
- Probably the first greeting cards, handmade valentines, appeared in the 16th century. As early
 as 1800, companies began mass-producing cards. Initially these cards were hand-colored by
 factory workers. By the early 20th century even fancy lace and ribbon-strewn cards were
 created by machine.

SIGNS OF PROGRESS: HISTORICALLY LOW NUMBER OF TRAFFIC DEATHS IN 2017

Fewest deaths on Saskatchewan roads since 1954

In 2017 Saskatchewan recorded the lowest number of traffic fatalities in more than six decades.

There were 102* deaths on Saskatchewan roads last year, a notable improvement from the 125 deaths in 2016 and the yearly average of 145 deaths in the previous decade (2007-2016).

The last time Saskatchewan recorded fewer traffic deaths was in 1954, when 74 people were killed. For context, there were less than one-third the number of registered vehicles in the province as there are today.

"We need to remember that traffic fatality statistics are so much more than numbers; each one was a real person who died needlessly, leaving behind a devastated family and loved ones," Minister Responsible for SGI Joe Hargrave said. "It's terrible that the families of 102 people had to deal with a tragic loss last year. The fact that we saw 23 fewer deaths than the year before is an encouraging sign. The credit for this improvement has to go to every single person in Saskatchewan who has made the choice to drive more safely."

SECOND LOWEST UNEMPLOYMENT RATE IN CANADA



Premier Scott Moe, "Wow Saskatchewan, you created 1,100 jobs last month! The fastest growth in Canada, dropping the unemployment rate by a full 1%.

We will keep standing with you so families and businesses always have the opportunity to prosper across our great province."

Saskatchewan's unemployment rate was 5.4 per cent (seasonally adjusted) in January – tied for the second lowest rate among the provinces and below the national rate of 5.9 per cent according to Statistics Canada.

There were 560,100 people employed, 1,500 more jobs compared to January 2017, including an increase of 4,900 full-time jobs.

Employment in Saskatchewan was up 1,100 from the previous month (0.2 per cent), the highest percentage increase among the provinces (seasonally adjusted). There were 6,200 full-time jobs

created month-over-month.
