# SASKATCHEWAN POSTS LARGEST SALARY INCREASES IN NOVEMBER

Average weekly earnings in Saskatchewan took a jump in November 2013, up 4.7 per cent over last November, the highest increase among the provinces and well ahead of the 2.5 per cent increase nationally.

Saskatchewan's average weekly earnings were \$967.45 in November 2013, the second highest in the nation. On a monthly basis, wages were up by 2.3 per cent between October 2013 and November 2013, the second highest percentage increase in Canada.

"Clearly, Saskatchewan's workforce is benefiting from the province's strong economic growth," Economy Minister Bill Boyd said. "Rising wages are leading to increased spending, further stimulating growth and diversifying our economic base, and more importantly has a positive impact on quality of life."

"Having the highest annual wage growth in the country is an enviable position to be in," Boyd said. "It helps us attract the skilled workforce needed to maintain our economic growth and is good news for workers right here, right now."

# **GOVERNMENT HELPS LOW-INCOME CITIZENS ACCESS JUSTICE SERVICES**

The province is providing financial support that will assist low-income individuals in accessing justice services in Saskatoon.

As part of a funding agreement between the Government of Saskatchewan and the Community Legal Assistance Services for Saskatoon Inner City Inc. (CLASSIC), the Ministry of Justice will provide a total of \$300,000 between 2013-2016. Justice Minister and Attorney General Gordon Wyant presented CLASSIC with a cheque for \$90,000 today in Saskatoon.

"The purpose of this funding agreement is two-fold," Wyant said. "It will support legal assistance for those who need it most and give Saskatchewan's next generation of lawyers the opportunity to learn hands-on about the legal community's responsibilities to equal access to justice."

The agreement provides funding for CLASSIC's Legal Advice Clinic, which provides direct legal assistance to low-income individuals in inner city Saskatoon. It will also be used to support the Walk-in Advocacy Clinic, which pairs College of Law students with practicing lawyers to provide advice, assistance, and representation to clients.

The Ministry of Justice has provided CLASSIC with financial support since the organization began operating in 2007.

#### ANOTHER RECORD YEAR FOR SASKATCHEWAN'S OIL PRODUCTION

Saskatchewan's oil patch set new records in 2013, in some categories surpassing benchmarks established just the year before.

The province's oil production for the calendar year just ended is 177.9 million barrels (487,400 barrels per day), up from the previous record of 172.9 million barrels (472,500 barrels per day) set in 2012. Drilling activity was robust, with a total of 2,433 horizontal oil wells drilled in 2013, a new record that surpasses the 2,036 horizontal oil wells drilled in 2012.

"These records reflect the hard work of the men and women employed in Saskatchewan's oil industry" Energy and Resources Minister Tim McMillan said. "The importance of the oil industry cannot be understated, as a top employer and exporter it contributes positively to communities throughout our province."

A total of 3,371 oil wells were drilled in 2013, the third best year ever for oil well drilling. This figure ranks behind only 2011 (3,528 oil wells) and 1997 (3,608 oil wells). The Lloydminster and

Kindersley/Kerrobert areas accounted for almost two-thirds of all drilling in 2013.

Saskatchewan is ranked as the number one jurisdiction in Canada for oil and gas investment policies, according to The Fraser Institute's annual Global Petroleum Survey.
