#### CENSUS SHOWS SASKATCHEWAN GREW BY 65,000 PEOPLE IN FIVE YEARS

Most Growth Ever in Any Five-Year Census Period

The 2011 Census count was released this week and it shows Saskatchewan grew by 65,224 between 2006 and 2011. That is by far the largest population growth in any census period since Statistics Canada starting doing the Census every five years in 1956.

The population growth also marks a complete reversal from the previous two census periods 1996 to 2001 and 2001 to 2006, which saw Saskatchewan's population drop by about 11,000 people during each five-year period. In its Census release, Statistics Canada called Saskatchewan a "turnaround," saying: "A complete turnaround occurred in Saskatchewan, where the population increased 6.7 per cent between 2006 and 2011, following declines of 1.1 per cent in each of the two previous intercensal periods."

Premier Brad Wall said the new census numbers show Saskatchewan is on the right track.

"Saskatchewan has gone from a province where people were moving out, to a province where people are choosing to stay and moving in," Wall said. "That is because of our growing economy, plenty of job opportunities and our great quality of life.

### THIRD QUARTER REPORT SHOWS PROVINCE ON TRACK FOR BALANCED BUDGET

The province will maintain a balanced budget in 2011-12, despite the challenges created by a second consecutive year of flooding

The total costs of flooding in Saskatchewan this year are expected to reach \$360 million in the 2011-12 fiscal year. This will be offset by \$193 million in federal cost-sharing contributions and a \$120 million special dividend from Crown Investments Corporation.

This reflects higher than expected earnings at SaskPower in 2011, while still allowing SaskPower to retain the full \$118.6 million budgeted for earnings in 2011. SaskPower enjoyed higher than expected earnings in 2011, due partly to higher water levels resulting in increased hydropower generation.

General Revenue Fund (GRF) expense is up \$331 million from budget, reflecting the unexpected flooding costs, the teachers' settlement, an increase for teachers' pensions and other utilization pressures. Net savings in other areas partially offset these increases.

At third quarter, GRF revenue is up \$272 million from budget. The increase reflects strength in many sectors and shows higher revenue from oil, potash, PST and Fuel Tax. These increases are offset by lower-than-expected Crown land sales and Corporation Income Tax.

The budget is on track to finish the year with a pre-transfer surplus of \$56 million and a balance of \$709 million in the Growth and Financial Security Fund. Despite the challenges this year, government debt reduction will proceed as budgeted.

"Last year's floods affected many Saskatchewan families, damaged many kilometres of highways and flooded thousands of acres of farmland," Finance Minister Ken Krawetz said. "We were fortunate to have access to the resources required to provide assistance to those in need.

"We have met severe challenges with flooding this year and last. In spite of that, we will finish the year with a balanced budget, lower debt and more than \$700 million in the Growth and Financial Security Fund thanks to the strength of our economy.

#### INNOVATION PLACE IN THE TOP 50 EMPLOYERS IN CANADA

Eighty-three per cent of Innovation Place employees are fully engaged in their work making them some of the most highly engaged workers in the country. #### LIMIT RAISED FOR VENTURE CAPITAL FUNDS

The Government of Saskatchewan has raised the annual cap for Labour-Sponsored Venture Capital Corporations (LSVCC) to \$55 million for the 2011-2012 tax season.

"Saskatchewan is growing and creating new opportunities for people across this province," Enterprise Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "Our government is always looking for ways to strengthen investment in our province."

LSVCC shares can be purchased through the two funds, SaskWorks Venture Fund Inc. and Golden Opportunities Fund Inc. This capital is in turn invested into small- and medium-sized Saskatchewan businesses to encourage growth and job creation.

The LSVCC funds and the legislation fall under the Invest in Saskatchewan Program, which provides a tax incentive to promote and encourage investment in registered pool and employee funds. On the first \$5,000 invested, investors are eligible to receive federal and provincial tax credits that total 35 per cent.

The Employee Investment Program also provides the opportunity for employees to invest in the company they work for and receive the same tax credits.

### SASKATOON FAMILY DWELLINGS UP 47.5% IN JANUARY 2012 COMPARED TO JANUARY 2011

Saskatchewan's housing market continued at a record pace in January according to a report released by CMHC. Urban housing starts were up 70.8 per cent in January 2012 when compared to last January. Saskatchewan's 473 housing starts were a record for the month of January.

"Saskatchewan's economy is forecasted by many to lead the nation this year," Enterprise Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "Record housing starts is a result of both the economic strength of the province and the record population increases we've seen over the last number of years."

Single family dwellings were up by 20.8 per cent in January 2012 over January 2011, while multiple units increased by 124.8 per cent. Regina had an increase of 118.1 per cent while Saskatoon had a 47.5 per cent increase over the same period.

"With great job opportunities across the province, Saskatchewan people are feeling confident in purchasing new homes," Harrison said. "The growth of available housing is vital as we continue to work to ensure Saskatchewan is the best place in Canada to work, live and raise a family."

Applications will close Friday, February 24, 2012, for Saskatchewan multiple sclerosis (MS) patients interested in volunteering for a clinical trial in Albany, New York.

#### SASKJOBS.CA STARTS THE YEAR WITH IMPRESSIVE NUMBERS

Last month, 14,717 job vacancies were posted to SaskJobs.ca, an increase of 44 per cent over January 2010 and an increase of 24 per cent over the month previous (December 2011). There were 931,372 visits to the site in January.

This clearly signals that job seekers are recognizing Saskatchewan as a great place to build a career.
