From a Provincial Point of View

It has been almost a month since the Keeping the Saskatchewan Advantage 2012-13 provincial budget was delivered and we remain the only province in Canada to have a truly balanced budget. We will continue to manage the province's finances in a fiscally responsible way that invests in the programs and services that are important to people of Saskatchewan.

Did you know:

- In terms of unemployment, the number of people without a job is decreasing. In fact, Saskatchewan currently has the lowest unemployment rate in the country at 4.8 per cent down from 5.0 last month and 5.2 a year ago. It is evident that people have confidence in our economy and businesses are expanding. That's the Saskatchewan Advantage.
- Saskatchewan was also recently ranked by the Fraser Institute's 2011 Global Petroleum Survey as the top jurisdiction in Canada for oil and gas investment. The oil and gas sector is one of Saskatchewan's leading industries, accounting for \$12.2 billion in sales in 2011 and an estimated \$4.5 billion in investment in exploration and development. This means that there were an estimated 33,200 jobs in the upstream oil and gas industry in 2011, a 9.0 per cent increase from 2010. This is another great example of our strong and growing economy.
- Since 2007, our government has increased investments in student housing by more than 3,000 per cent, allowing us to provide more than 1,000 new bed for students across the province.
- Since 2007 our government has increased the number of child care spaces in Saskatchewan by 3,400. Over the next four years, we have promised to further increase that number by 2,000.
- Since 2007, our government has improved 6,000 kilometres of highways. Over the next four years our government will invest a further \$2.2 billion to improve highways.

Premier Brad Wall spoke at a national health care conference in Montebello, Quebec, April 18 where he made the case for innovative approaches to reform that include bold targets and new ways of delivering services. The Premier participated in a panel discussion at the event, which was organized by the Canada Health Infoway. Also on the panel are respected economist Don Drummond, who recently chaired a commission on reform of Ontario's public services, and award winning Globe and Mail journalist André Picard.

"Our publicly funded health care system will remain sustainable only if we have clear performance objectives and a concerted effort to deliver services in a more efficient, effective manner," Wall said. "I'm looking forward to discussing important initiatives underway in Saskatchewan that are saving money and delivering better patient care."

HOUSING STARTS JUMP MORE THAN 50 PER CENT

Saskatchewan's urban housing starts took a huge jump in March 2012, up by 53.5 per cent over last March according to a report issued by CMHC today. For the first quarter of 2012 urban housing starts are up 33.8 per cent over the same period in 2011.

"A strong economy is bringing more people to our province, driving a demand for new housing," Enterprise Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "The availability of jobs and business opportunities is attracting people from all over the globe and is bringing our expatriates home. More and more families are choosing our province as the place to start a life."

SASKATCHEWAN EXPORTS SOAR IN FEBRUARY

Saskatchewan's merchandise exports continue to increase, reaching \$2.62 billion in February 2012, up 22.2 per cent from the \$2.15 billion recorded in February 2011 according to a new report from Statistics Canada.

SAID APPLICATION REMINDER

The Government of Saskatchewan has committed to expanded enrolment and substantial increases to the Saskatchewan Assured Income for Disability (SAID) benefit. In addition to the \$50 increase in January 2012, there will be increases of \$100 per month over four years for those living in residential care, \$350 per month over four years for those in independent living arrangements, and \$400 per month over four years for couples with disabilities who are living independently. Between March 12 and 30, 12,000 application and assessment packages were mailed out across the province in order to help expand the SAID program and increase enrolment from the current caseload of 3,500 people. These assessments are underway with enrolment and new benefits scheduled to begin June 2012.

All individuals currently receiving a disability benefit through the Saskatchewan Assistance Program (SAP) are reminded to complete and return their application and disability impact assessment packages as soon as possible to determine if they are eligible for the SAID program.

"The SAID program expansion is one way that this government is helping to make Saskatchewan the best place in Canada to live for people with disabilities," Social Services Minister June Draude said. "In order to ensure we include as many qualified people as possible in the enhanced program, it is vital that these assessment packages are completed."

Drop-in sessions for people who want help filling out their SAID application and assessment forms will be held in Regina and Saskatoon over the next couple of weeks.
